Senator Francisco moved to change wording page 2, line 41 from 10% to 5%. Second by Senator Betts. Motion carried..

Senator Francisco moved and it was second by Senator Betts to move **HB 2322** out favorable. Motion carried..

Ken Wilke gave brief summary of <u>HB 2058</u> concerning counties; enforcement of codes and resolutions. Senator Pyle moved to include 5 more counties to page 2, line 40. Senator Huelskamp second. Discussion.

Senator Francisco motioned to leave "in any county" as the amendment states on page 2 line 40. Motion carried..

Senator Pyle motioned and second by Senator Reitz to move out **HB 2058** as amended. Motion carried..

Honorable Senator Ostmeyer:

The County Commissioners had a special meeting this morning and decided that they would like to have the following voting plan for HB 2307:

At large-at large County Commissioner Election:

Qualifications: The candidate must be a resident of Sherman County and must be an elector at the time of filing and shall file for the office of County Commissioner with the Sherman County Election officer.

Filing Deadline: The deadline for partiy candidates to file is at noon on June 10 of the year of the election or if the 10th is on a weekend, the deadline is noon on the next business day. The June deadline for a candidate to withdraw their name is also at noon on June 10.

The individual will file as a Democrat or a Republican and they must complete all necessary paperwork.

All qualified voters who are affilitated with a given party may vote in the Primary Election. Voters will be allowed to vote for the same number of candidates as the number of positions open. Example: During a Presidential election years, there will be two (2) positions open for election and during Gubernatorial election years, there will be one (1) position open for election.

The candidate or two candidates receiving the highest number of votes in the Primary Election from each party will be the candidates that are nominated by each part and their name/names will go on the General ballot. All qualified voters in Sherman County will be allowed to vote for the office of County Commissioner and will vote for the same number or fewer candidates as the number of positions that are open (in addition to the candidates that were nominated).

Brad Bryant may need to get with you and tweek this wording, but it is the concept of what the Commissioners are wanting. I had faxed a copy of the options that I had come up with for the Commissioners to review and decide on. I have not heard back yet from Brad. Hopefully, it will clarify all of Brad's concerns that he had about how the election would be handled.

HOUSE BILL No. 2094

AN ACT concerning elections; amending K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 25-213 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas

Section 1. K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 25-213 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-213. At all national and state primary elections, the national and state offices as specified for each in this section shall be printed upon the official primary election ballot for national and state offices and the county and township offices as specified for each in this section shall be printed upon the official primary election ballot for county and township offices. The official primary election ballots shall have the following heading:

OFFICIAL PRIMARY ELECTION BALLOT

_____ Party

To vote for a person whose name is printed on the ballot make a cross or check mark in the square at the left of the person's name. To vote for a person whose name is not printed on the ballot, write the person's name in the blank space, if any is provided, and make a cross or check mark in the square to the left.

The words national and state or the words county and township shall appear on the line preceding the part of the form shown above.

The form shown shall be followed by the names of the persons for whom nomination petitions or declarations have been filed according to law for political parties having primary elections, and for the national and state offices in the following order: United States senator, United States representative from ______ district, governor and lieutenant governor, secretary of state, attorney general, state treasurer, commissioner of insurance, senator ______ district, representative ______ district, district judge ______ district, district magistrate judge ______ district, district attorney __ judicial district, and member state board of education ______ district. For county and township offices the form shall be followed by the names of persons for whom nomination petitions or declarations have been filed according to law for political parties having primary elections in the following order: commissioner ______ district, county clerk, treasurer, register of deeds, county attorney, sheriff, township trustee, township trea-

surer, township clerk. When any office is not to be elected, it shall be omitted from the ballot. Other offices to be elected but not listed, shall be inserted in the proper places. For each office there shall be a statement of the number to vote for.

To the left of each name there shall be printed a square. Official primary election ballots may be printed in one or more columns. The names certified by the secretary of state or county election officer shall be printed on official primary election ballots and no others. In case there are no nomination petitions or declarations on file for any particular office, the title to the office shall be printed on the ballot followed by a blank line with a square, and such title, followed by a blank line, may be printed in the list of candidates published in the official paper. No blank line shall be printed following any office where there are nomination petitions or declarations on file for the office except following the offices of precinct committeeman and precinct committeewoman. Except as otherwise provided in this section, no person's name shall be printed more than once on either the official primary election ballot for national and state offices or the official primary election ballot for county and township offices. No name that is printed on the official primary election ballot as a candidate of a political party shall be printed or written in as a candidate for any office on the official primary election ballot of any other political party. If a person is a candidate for the unexpired term for an office, the person's name may be printed on the same ballot as a candidate for the next regular term for such office. The name of any candidate on the ballot may be printed on the same ballot as such candidate and also as a candidate for precinct committeeman or committeewoman. No name that is printed on the official primary election ballot for national and state offices shall be printed or written in elsewhere on such ballot or on the official primary election ballot for county and township offices except for precinct committeeman or committeewoman. No name that is printed on the official primary election ballot for county and township offices shall be printed or written in on the official primary election ballot for national and state offices or elsewhere on such county and township ballot except for precinct committeeman or committeewoman.

No person shall be elected to the office of precinct committeeman or precinct committeewoman where no nomination petitions or declarations have been filed, unless the person receives at least five write-in votes. As a result of a primary election, no person shall receive the nomination and no person's name shall be printed on the official general election ballot when no nomination petitions or declarations were filed unless the person receives votes equal in number to not less than 10% of the electors who voted for the office of secretary of state at the last preceding general election for such office total of the current voter registration of the party



designated in the state, county or district in which the office is sought
