Colonel Deborah Rose, appeared before the committee to answer questions on her appointment to Chief of Staff, Kansas Air National Guard. SB 368 - Professional corporations, allowing licensed audiologists to form

(Attachment 2) The bill would allow a licensed audiologist to organize as a professional corporation under the Kansas Professional Corporation Code, and the proposed amendment would propose the same flexibility be made available to licensed speech-language pathologists.

Jeffrey Brown, Triplett, Woolf & Garretson, LLC, provided written testimony in support of the bill and amendment. (Attachment 3)

Chairman Brungardt closed the hearing on SB 368.

JOHN C. PETERSON KANSAS SPEECH-LANGUAGE-HEARING ASSOCIATION TESTIMONY IN SUPPORT OF SENATE BILL 368 SENATE COMMITTEE ON FEDERAL AND STATE AFFAIRS March 13, 2007

Mr. Chairman, Senators. My name is John Peterson. I am pleased to appear today in support of Senate Bill 368 on behalf of Kansas Speech-Language-Hearing Association. The Kansas-Speech-Language-Hearing Association is a professional trade association for licensed speech pathologists and licensed audiologists in the State of Kansas, over 1,000 of which are members of this Association.

We appear today in support of Senate Bill 368 which would allow a licensed audiologist to organize as a professional corporation under the Kansas Professional Corporation Code. We believe that this alternative would allow greater flexibility for a licensed audiologist who is in private practice and desires to organize in a corporate structure.

We would propose that the same flexibility be made available to licensed speech-language pathologists and are proposing an amendment that would allow for such an option. We further believe that it is desirable to amend K.S.A. 17-2710, the statute that allows two or more professions to join together as a professional corporation, be amended to reflect conformity to this proposed change. Those amendments are on the attached balloon.

We would urge your favorable consideration of the proposed amendments and Senate Bill 368. Thank you.
