MINUTES OF THE SENATE FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS AND INSURANCE COMMITTEE

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Ruth Teichman at 9:30 A.M. on February 7, 2007 in Room 234-N of the Capitol.

The Chair called the meeting to order and welcomed John Thomas Thull to his confirmation hearing as State Banking Commissioner. Mr.Thull gave an overview of his past employment. (<u>Attachment 1</u>)

Senator Wysong moved recommendation of John Thomas Thull as State Banking Commissioner to the full Senate. Senator Brungardt seconded. Motion carried.

Hearing on:

SB 154 - concerning municipal bonds; relating to the limit on the amount of the bond issue; amending K.S.A. 10-106 and repealing the existing section.

The Chair asked Dale Goter, City of Wichita, for his testimony. Mr. Goter said the City of Wichita seeks legislative approval for an amendment to K.S.A. 10-106, increasing the statutory cap on bonds that may be sold through public notice or private sale for municipal bond projects. Current law sets the cap at \$100,000; the amendment raises that cap to \$2 million.

By raising the cap on negotiated bond placements, the city could pool as much as \$2 million in 20-year bonds and work directly with local bond houses to place the obligations at a more competitive rate resulting in financial benefits to homeowners and others who make the monthly special assessment repayments. (Attachment 2)

The Chair closed the hearing on **SB 154.**

Hearing on:

SB 197 - concerning the office of the state bank commissioner; relating to the office of administrative hearings; exception; amending K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 75-37,121 and repealing the existing section.

Sonya Allen, State Commissioner's Office General Counsel, testified that this bill would include an amendment to add the "Office of the State Bank Commissioner," in addition to the "State Banking Board," to the list of exempt entities. Ms. Allen said this amendment reflects the original intent of the law when it was drafted and current practices allow for the greatest efficiency in terms of providing timely hearings to individuals who have been denied a license or have been the subject of some other administrative action, and whose appeal is to the Commissioner or Administrator of the UCCC. The amendment would allow us to continue our existing hearing process. The current process ensures that the individual hearing the matter has expertise in this area of the law, and provides an accurate and consistent interpretation of the Kansas Mortgage Business Act and the Kansas Uniform Consumer Credit Code. The Office of the State Bank Commissioner respectfully requests favorable consideration of <u>SB 197</u>. (<u>Attachment 3</u>)

THE LEGISLATIVE ISSUE:

The City of Wichita seeks legislative approval for an amendment to K.S.A 10-106, increasing the statutory cap on bonds that may be sold through public notice or private sale (negotiated) for municipal bond (including special assessment) projects. Current law sets the cap at \$100,000; the amendment raises that cap to \$2 million.

EXPLANATION:

Each year, the City of Wichita issues special assessment bonds for tens of millions of dollars to finance public improvements in various city development projects. Currently, the City is carrying \$217 million in special assessment debt, which is repaid from special assessments collected from property owners and/or developers.

In most cases, the City goes to the bond market with as much as \$22 million worth of projects, soliciting bond placement in a national competitive market for 15-year obligations.

Several years ago, the City of Wichita created a separate bonding program that offered 20-year financing for certain special assessments. The program was targeted at projects that carried unusually high costs due to special circumstances such as unique drainage problems or other complications that drive up the total project costs.

The option of 20-year funding helps reduce the monthly cost to property owners who repay the bonds as special assessments.

Unfortunately, the number of such projects is limited. The City tries to accumulate as many as possible before going to market, but the total is often too small to draw competitive attention from bond brokers.

By raising the cap on negotiated bond placements, the City could pool as much as \$2 million in 20-year bonds and work directly with local bond houses to place the obligations at a more competitive rate. The net result is expected to be a more competitive rate for these limited issues, and a resulting financial benefits to homeowners and others who make the monthly special assessment repayments.

Madame Chairperson and Members of the Committee:

My name is Sonya Allen, and I am the General Counsel for the Office of the State Bank Commissioner. I am testifying today in support of SB 197.

Several years ago, the Legislature created a central administrative hearing body within the Department of Administration called the Office of Administrative Hearings. The law phases in required use of the Office of Administrative Hearings by many state agencies over a number of years, and in 2009, the last group of agencies is added. That 2009 language currently provides an exemption for the fee funded agencies from using the Office of Administrative Hearings. With regard to our agency, which is fee funded, the current language in the statute includes an exemption for hearings conducted by the "State Banking Board". The State Banking Board is the entity that hears appeals from decisions of the Commissioner on a number of application and licensing issues. However, for some other laws that the agency enforces, the appeal is to the Commissioner or the Administrator of the Kansas Uniform Consumer Credit Code (UCCC), rather than the Banking Board. So, on July 1, 2009, our agency will be half-in and half-out of the requirement to use the Office of Administrative Hearings. This bill would include an amendment to add the "Office of the State Bank Commissioner", in addition to the "State Banking Board", to the list of exempt entities. The primary reasons we are requesting your consideration of this bill are:

- 1.) We believe this amendment reflects the original intent of the law when it was drafted; i.e., to exempt our entire agency from being required to use the Office of Administrative Hearings; and
- 2.) We believe our current practices allow for the greatest efficiency in terms of providing timely hearings to individuals who have been denied a license or have been the subject of some other administrative action, and whose appeal is to the Commissioner or Administrator of the UCCC. The amendment would allow us to continue our existing hearing process. Our current process ensures that the individual hearing the matter has expertise in this area of the law, and provides an accurate and consistent interpretation of the Kansas Mortgage Business Act and the Kansas Uniform Consumer Credit Code. This timeliness, expertise and consistency are beneficial to our agency as well as to the individual or company who has requested a hearing.

For these reasons, the Office of the State Bank Commissioner would respectfully request your favorable consideration of SB 197.
