## MINUTES OF THE SENATE TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE

Chairman Donovan reviewed the status of all the bills in the committee and appointed a subcommittee for <u>SB</u> <u>295---Salvage vehicle pool dealer; bid cards</u>. He named himself as Chairman and Senator Wilson and Senator Gilstrap as members.

Chairman Donovan presented the minutes for February 1<sup>st</sup> and February 14<sup>th</sup> for approval. <u>Senator Schmidt</u> made a motion to approve the minutes as written. <u>Senator Journey seconded the motion</u>. <u>The motion carried</u>.

Senator Hensley made a motion to amend the bill to provide liability protection for law enforcement who have to break into the vehicle to rescue children left unattended. Senator Wilson seconded the motion. The motion carried. Senator Hensley made a motion to pass the bill as amended favorably for passage. Senator Schmidt seconded the motion. The motion carried.. Senator Schmidt will carry the bill.

Senator Journey said he was hoping the committee would be kind enough to look at t **SB 6--Driver's licenses**, **habitual violators**, **allowing use motorized bicycle license**. Chairman Donovan said he wished he'd asked him ahead of time. The agenda for today was already set.

## SENATE BILL No. 3

By Senator Journey

AN ACT relating to roads and highways; providing for highway safety memorial markers.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) The secretary of transportation with respect to state highways and local authorities with respect to highways under their jurisdiction may erect and maintain highway safety memorial markers in accordance with the provisions of this section.

(b) The secretary of transportation and local authorities may allow the placement of highway safety memorial markers for the purpose of memorializing people who have died as a result of a vehicle-related crash and to remind motorists to protect human life by driving safety.

(c) Requests for highway safety memorial markers may be made by either immediate family members or friends. Requests made by friends shall require the approval of the immediate family of the deceased person.

(d) The cost for the construction, maintenance and removal of a highway safety memorial marker shall be paid by the Kansas department of transportation for state highways and by local authorities with respect to highways under their jurisdiction

(e) Highway safety memorial markers shall be allowed to remain in place for a minimum of one year, unless it becomes necessary to remove it due to construction or maintenance purposes. If, after one year, the highway safety memorial marker has been removed for any reason, the marker may be replaced by following the initial request procedure provided by this section.

(f) Highway safety memorial markers shall be designed by the Kansas department of transportation.

(g) Unauthorized memorial markers installed by private citizens shall be removed by either the department of transportation for state highways and local authorities with respect to highways under their jurisdiction.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.

Such state highway safety memorial markers shall not be placed until the secretary of transportation has received sufficient moneys from gifts and donations to reimburse the secretary for the cost of placing such state highway safety memorial markers and an additional 50% of the initial cost to defray future maintenance or replacement costs of such state highway safety memorial markers. The secretary of transportation may accept and administer gifts and donations to aid in obtaining and installing suitable state highway safety memorial markers.

(e) Such local highway safety memorial markers shall not be placed until the local authorities with respect to highways under their jurisdiction have received sufficient moneys from gifts and donations to reimburse such local authorities for the cost of placing such highway safety memorial markers and an additional 50% of the initial cost to defray future maintenance or replacement costs of such highway safety memorial markers.
