SB 128 - Requiring certain electric utilities to provide energy conservation information to consumers, establishing the energy conservation promotion education advisory group

Chair asked Paul Snider, Kansas City Power and Light, to explain the reasoning for the six amendments proposed in a balloon to **SB 128**. (<u>Attachment 1</u>)

David Springe, CURB, offered his objections to their proposed amendment 6.

Martha Smith, Kansas Manufactured Housing Association, presented the suggestions agreed to by the Kansas Association of Realtors, Kansas Manfactured Housing Association and the Kansas Building Industry Association to add additional members to the KEC education advisory group in **SB 128**. (Attachment 2)

Leslie Kaufman of the Kansas Cooperative Council provided written acknowledgment of these proposed additional members and added a representative for agriculture. (Attachment 3)

Considerable discussion on the definition of the representative for agriculture and consensus it should be a person engaged in agriculture production - a farmer.

Moved by Senator Francisco, seconded by Senator Petersen, amend **SB 128** on page 1, line 18 by inserting the words "education and conservation" following the word 'with' and before the word 'standard'. Motion carried.

Moved by Senator Francisco, seconded by Senator Reitz, amend SB 128 page 3,line 6-8 "(h) The regulated utilities shall be expected to pursue cost recovery for design, development implementation, promotion, ongoing expense and evaluation costs of these programs through the normal rate making process." Motion carried.

Moved by Senator Taddiken, seconded by Senator Reitz, amend SB 128, page 1, line 15, approve the insertion of the word "require" after the word 'shall' and delete the language "develop and administer a program requiring". Motion carried.

Moved by Senator Reitz, seconded by Senator Petersen, amend **SB 128**, page 1, line 20, delete the word "shall" and insert the word "may". Motion carried.

Moved by Senator Petersen, seconded by Senator Pine, amend **SB 128**, page 2, line 17-18, delete the language "which shall be defined as a percentage of energy consumption." Motion carried.

Senator Apple reported that two meetings had been held by the Subcommittee on **SB 20** and a two tier system was recommended. Senator Francisco noted tier one does not include potable water and this needs more definition. No action taken as time did not permit.

Chairman Emler announced that he would request that SB 325 and SB 20 be blessed.

  - (B) financing options for energy conservation improvements;

(D) performance measures and goals.

- (2) The energy conservation advisory group shall develop separate energy conservation education curricula for the general public, public school students, local governments, residential, commercial and utility classes and the transportation sector.
- (3) The energy conservation education advisory group shall recommend performance measures and goals to monitor the effectiveness of the programs authorized pursuant to this section which shall be defined as a percentage of energy consumption. The Kansas energy office of the state corporation commission shall consult with the energy conservation education advisory group before adopting baseline data and goals, data collection methodology and reporting formats.
- (e) On and after July 1, 2008, each electric utility, municipal electric utility and electric cooperative utility doing business in Kansas shall provide such utility's consumers with information concerning energy conservation opportunities and options in accordance with and subject to the standards prescribed by the energy conservation education advisory group and the Kansas energy office of the state corporation commission, which shall include, but not be limited to:
- (1) Increasing general awareness and understanding of energy conservation opportunities;
- (2) information designed to encourage direct energy consumers to increase their understanding of conservation opportunities specific to such consumer's energy-use type; and
- (3) information on energy conservation measures prescribed in the Kansas energy efficiency disclosure form prepared and disseminated by the state corporation commission pursuant to K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 66-1228, and amendments thereto.
- (f) Electric utilities, municipal electric utilities and electric cooperative utilities, shall annually submit a report to the legislature the Kansas energy effice of the state corporation commission and the Kansas energy council on or before the beginning of the regular session of the legislature beginning in 2010 on the performance measures and goal outcomes of the energy education and energy conservation promotion programs pre-

RE: SB 128 – Membership composition of the Kansas Energy Conservation Education Advisory Group – adding an ag rep.

We understand you are scheduled to consider SB 128 for possible committee action on Monday, February 19, 2007. As you know, the Council did not comment on this bill at the committee hearing. Since that time, it has come to our attention that the make-up of the Kansas Energy Conservation Education Advisory Group (Advisory Group) lacks representation from the agricultural sector.

As we understand the bill, the Energy Conservation Education Advisory Group will play a key role in developing performance measures, goals and standards for energy education and conservation promotion programs. Included in these strategies will be information related to specific consumer's energy-use type.

In reviewing the Advisory Group's statutory charge and the panel's membership listing, two things stood out to us. First, we noticed the group lacked representation from the agricultural sector and secondly, apart from the CURB representative, there is not much representation from those that are actually endusers/consumers of energy sources. From our perspective, if the Advisory Group is going to be developing standards for programs to educate energy users, it would seem useful for the Group to know such things as:

- Who theses users are:
- How they utilize various forms of energy;
- What their energy needs are;
- What there needs are likely to be in the future:
- The various energy sources they rely on; and
- What types of information delivery systems work within their industry?

Thus, having someone from that industry/user class would seem to us to be a wise addition to this Advisory Group.

We understand there have been suggestions to add additional members to the Advisory Group and that these suggestions have been brought to you by the Kansas Association of Realtors, Kansas Manufactured Housing Association and the Kansas Building Industry Association. We have been in contact with them and are supportive of their additions, as well as the inclusion of a representative from agriculture/agribusiness. It is my understanding that they may have even incorporated the agriculture member in their draft balloon. If not, I have attached a copy of their balloon with the addition of such a representative of the agricultural sector.
