Hearing on SB 702 and SB 703

<u>Hearing on SB 702 - Continuation of certain exceptions to disclosure under the open records act and SB 703 - Reconciling amendments to certain statutes.</u>

Jim Wilson, Revisor of Statutes, explained that <u>SB 702</u> addresses technical corrections to the open records statutes to continue 14 statutory exceptions until July 15, 2009, in order for legislative reviews of each provision to be completed (<u>Attachment 1</u>). Mr. Wilson noted that the comprehensive review of the Opens Records Act is not complete at this time and the extension will allow for the comprehensive review to be completed.

SB 703, reconciling amendments to certain statutes

This bill reconciles amendments to statutes which were amended more than once during this session or a prior session.

- Notice for failure to comply with a traffic citation; statute amended in Senate Bill No. 366 and House Bill No. 2968.
 - § 2: Kansas Criminal Code, definitions; statute amended twice in 2005.
- § 3: Food vending machines; statute amended in Senate Bill No. 557 and Senate Bill No. 584.
- § 4: Claim for unpaid wages; statute was amended effective July 1, 2008, by section 14 of the chapter 145 of the 2004 Session Laws.
- Transfers to the abandoned oil and gas well fund; statute amended in House Bill No. 2735 and Senate Bill No. 534.
- Guardians and conservators; title and repealer sections were incorrect in § 6: House Bill No. 2644, amendment to the statute remains the same.
- Nonresident pharmacy registration; statute amended in House Bill No. § 7: 2207 and Senate Bill No. 491.

- § 8: State moneys, investment; statute amended in Senate Bill No. 387 and Senate Bill No. 472.
- § 9: Repeal of statutes reconciled in the bill; also repeal of statute due to incorrect repealer section in chapter 95 of the 2007 Session Laws (K.S.A. 65-4603); also repeal of statutes containing amendments identical to other amendments passed in 2006 (K.S.A. 2007 Supp. 72-6624a and 72-6625a).
- § 10: Repeal of statutes reconciled in the bill; delayed effective date which matches effective date in Senate Bill No. 557 and Senate Bill No. 584.
