## HB 2969: Virtual school act SB 669: Virtual schools; funding; enrollment; administration

Chairman Aurand explained to Committee members the Subcommittee Report on Virtual Schools (Attachment 1 and  $\cdot 2$ )

Chairman Aurand moved to adopt the Subcommittee Report for SB 669. Representative Horst seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Representative Faber moved to pass out SB 669 favorably, as amended. Representative Horst seconded the motion. The motion carried.

# SB 531: School finance; base state aid per pupil

Representative Faber moved to pass out SB 531 favorably for passage. The motion was seconded by Representative Otto. After a discussion among Committee members, Representative Faber withdrew the motion.

Representative Crow moved for an amendment, subject to Appropriations, which would take some of the \$31 million and, rather than on a per teacher basis, would distribute funds on the number of eligible students that are receiving Medicaid funding services. The motion was seconded by Representative Horst. (Attachment 3)

After a lengthy discussion among Committee members, Representative Spalding moved for a substitute motion to include in Representative Crow's amendment, in school year 2008-09 and each school year thereafter, any amount appropriated for state aid for special education and related services which exceeds the amount appropriated in the preceding school year, shall be distributed first to those school districts which received less than 92% of the amount of the district's actual cost of providing special education and related services during the previous school year and any amount remaining after making the distribution required shall be distributed to all school districts as described in the Medicaid Replacement State Aid section. Representative Colloton seconded the motion. The motion failed.

The Committee was referred back to Representative Crow's amendment. The amendment carried by show of hands, 14 - yes and 7 - no.

Chairman Aurand moved for an amendment to 1) add the contents of HB 2734 which would change current school consolidation law and would, as amended, guarantee combined general fund budgets in varying lengths to varioussized school districts desiring to consolidate, and 2) amend the bill by adding an option to school consolidation agreements requiring a dual majority of qualified electors voting in favor of consolidation. The motion was seconded by Representative Horst. It was requested that the motion be divided in to two parts. Both parts of the motion carried. (Attachment : 4)

Representative Colloton moved for an amendment to SB 531 which would include the second count date, SB 459. The motion was seconded by Representative Spalding. The motion failed. (Attachment 5)

Representative Mah moved to pass out SB 531, as amended, favorably for passage. The motion was seconded by Representative Horst. The motion carried.

Chairman Aurand introduced his parents, Glen and Helen Aurand of Courtland, Kansas, who were visiting the Capitol.

Chairman Aurand thanked the staff and Committee members for their commitment and expertise these past two vears.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:55 A.M. No further meetings are anticipated for this legislative session.

• A pupil with an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) and attending a virtual school shall be counted as the proportion of one pupil (to the nearest 1/10) that the pupil's attendance at the non-virtual school bears to full-time attendance.

# Proposed Legislation:

The Subcommittee recommends Senate Bill 669 be amended to include the Subcommittee recommendations.

Officials with the Department of Education estimated the impact of the Subcommittee recommendations would be expense neutral.

The product is the amount of medicaid replacement state aid the district is entitled to receive.
- (c) The state board shall make the distribution of moneys under this section prior to determining the amount of state aid to be distributed under K.S.A. 72-978, and amendments thereto.
- (d) All amounts received by a school district under this section shall be deposited in the general fund of the district and shall be transferred to the special education fund of the district.
- (e) The board of education of any district desiring to receive state aid pursuant to this section shall submit any documentation or information to the state board as it may request.
  - (f) The state board shall prescribe all forms necessary for reporting under this act.";

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 2007 Supp. 72-6448 is hereby amended to read as follows: 72-6448. (a) (1) As used in this subsection, "pupil" shall have the meaning ascribed thereto in K.S.A. 72-6407, and amendments thereto.

- (2) If the number of pupils enrolled in a district on February 20, of each school year has increased from the number of pupils enrolled in the district on the preceding September 20, by at least 25 pupils or by a number equal to 1% or more of the district's enrollment, the enrollment of the district for such school year shall be determined on February 20.
- (3) The state board shall compute the general fund budget of a school district as follows:
- (A) Compute the general fund budget of the district using the enrollment of the district on February 20 of each school year;
- (B) compute the general fund budget of the district using the enrollment of the district on the preceding September 20 of such school year;
- (C) subtract the amount determined under paragraph (B) from the amount determined under paragraph (A);
  - (D) multiply the difference obtained under paragraph (C) by .50; and
- (E) add the product obtained under paragraph (D) to the amount determined under paragraph (B). The sum is the general fund budget of the school district.
- (4) This section shall be subject to the provisions of subsection (b). [The provisions of this subsection shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2009.]
- (b) (1) As used in this section subsection, "pupil" means a person who is a dependent of a full-time active duty member of the military service or a dependent of a member of any of the United States military reserve forces who has been ordered to active duty under section 12301, 12302 or 12304 of Title 10 of the United States Code, or ordered to full-time active duty for a period of more than 30 consecutive days under section 502(f) or 512 of Title 32 of the United States Code for the pur-
