AN ACT establishing the joint committee on the 2010 comprehensive
transportation plan.

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13 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) There is hereby established a joint committee on the 14 2010 comprehensive transportation plan which shall consist of eight 15 16 members of the house of representatives and seven members of the senate. Members who are representatives shall be appointed by the speaker 17 of the house of representatives. Members who are senators shall be ap-18 pointed by the president of the senate. The speaker of the house of rep-19 resentatives shall designate a representative member to be chairperson 20or vice-chairperson of the committee as provided by this section. The 21 president of the senate shall designate a senator member to be chairper-22 son or vice-chairperson of the joint committee as provided by this section. 23 (b) Members All members of the joint committee on the 2010 com-24 prehensive transportation plan shall serve for a term ending on January 25 1,-2010, and the ensuing term shall end on July 1, 2010 terms of two 26 years ending on the first day of the regular session of the legislature 27commencing in the first odd-numbered year after the year of ap-28 pointment, except that the first members shall be appointed on July 29 1, 2008, and shall serve for terms ending on the first day of the 30 regular session of the legislature commencing in 2009. The joint com-31 mittee on the 2010 comprehensive transportation plan shall not meet on 32 or before September 30, November 15, 2008. 33

(c) A quorum of the joint committee on the 2010 comprehensive 34 transportation plan shall be eight. All actions of the committee may be 35 taken by a majority of those present when there is a quorum. On and 36 after the effective date of this act until January 1, 2010, the chairperson 37 of the joint committee shall be a designated member of the senate, and 38 the vice-chairperson shall be a designated member of the house of rep-39 resentatives and on and after January 1, 2010, the chairperson shall be a 40 designated member of the house of representatives and the vice-chair-41 person shall be a designated member of the senate. The vice-chairperson 42 shall exercise all of the powers of the chairperson in the absence of the 43

If a vacancy occurs in the office of any member of the joint committee on the 2010 comprehensive transportation plan, a successor shall be appointed in the same manner as the original appointment for the remainder of the term.

the condition and extent of the state transportation system and 22 (2)infrastructure, including, but not limited to, railroads, airports, trucks 23 24 and public transit; and

(3) issues relating to transportation needs to be addressed in the next $(4)\frac{25}{26}$ comprehensive transportation plan legislation including financing options and priorities for funding. 27

(h) The joint committee on the 2010 comprehensive transpor-28 tation may introduce such legislation as deemed necessary in per-29

30 forming its function.

(h) (i) The joint committee on the 2010 comprehensive transporta-31 tion plan shall submit a written report to the legislature on or before 32 December 31, 2008, December 31, 2009 and December 31, 2010. 33

(i) The provisions of this section shall expire on July 1, $\frac{2010}{2011}$. 34 Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 35

publication in the statute book. 36

If a vacancy occurs in the office of the chairperson or vice-chairperson, a member of the joint committee on the 2010 comprehensive transportation plan who is a member of the same house of the legislature as the member who vacated the office shall be appointed by the president of the senate, if the vacating member was a member of the senate, or by the speaker of the house, if the vacating member was a member of the house of representatives, to fill such vacancy.
