The Chairman called for final action on <u>HB 2825–Closing court proceedings and sealing court records;</u> good cause finding on the record required. The Chairman reviewed the bill.

Senator Lynn moved, Senator Journey seconded, to recommend **HB 2825** favorably for passage. Motion carried.

The Chairman called for final action on <u>HB 2732—Sentencing</u>, <u>mitigating factors</u>, <u>departure limitations</u> on <u>crime of extreme sexual violence</u>. The Chairman reviewed the bill.

Senator Journey moved, Senator Goodwin seconded, to table HB 2732. Motion carried.

The Chairman called for final action on <u>SB 591–Allowing offenders who owe fines or restitution to be issued a restricted driver's license if they are in compliance with a payment agreement</u>. Senator Journey reviewed the bill and distributed a balloon amendment (<u>Attachment 1</u>).

Senator Journey moved, Senator Donovan seconded, to amend **SB 591** by gutting the bill and inserting the language reflected in the balloon with an effective date of January 1, 2009, and a sunset date of January 1, 2011. Motion carried.

Senator Journey moved, Senator Betts seconded, to recommend SB 591 as amended, favorably for passage. Motion carried.

The Chairman called for final action on <u>SB 671–Mistreatment of dependent adults</u>; increased penalties; <u>definition of fiduciary abuse</u>. The Chairman reviewed the bill.

Senator Lynn moved, Senator Journey seconded, to recommend SB 671 for an interim study. Motion carried.

The Chairman thanked the committee for their hard work during the session..

The meeting adjourned at 10:05 A.M. This was the last scheduled meeting of the 2008 session.

...."terms of the traffic citation has been furnished by the informing court. In lieu of suspension, the driver may submit a written request, with a \$25.00 application fee, for restricted driving privileges. Upon review and approval of the driver's eligibility, the driving privileges will be restricted pursuant to K.S.A. 8-292 for a period up to one year or until the terms of the traffic citation have been complied with and immediately electronically notify the division of vehicles. If the driver fails to comply with the traffic citation within the one year restricted period, the driving privileges will be suspended until the court determines the person has complied with the terms of the traffic citation and shall immediately electronically notify the division of vehicles of such compliance. " Upon receipt of notification of such compliance from the informing court, the division of vehicles shall terminate the suspension action."
