MINUTES OF THE SENATE TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Dwayne Umbarger at 8:30 a.m. on February 13, 2009 in Room 136-N of the Capitol.

The Chairman called for final action on SB 46 - Procedures for sale of certain property by port authorities.

Hank Avila reviewed <u>SB 46</u> and distributed copies of the agreement between Mid-States Port Authority (MSPA) and Kyle Railroad that includes the requirement of Kyle to honor all term extensions of leases that had been made known to Kyle as per the listing provided by MSPA (<u>Attachment 1</u>). The Chairman indicated there would be no need for the amendment requested at the February 5 hearing since all interested parties had reached an agreement.

Senator Hensley moved, Senator Kultala seconded, to recommend SB 46 favorably for passage. Motion carried.

Final action on SB 59 - Primary seat belt law, penalty.

The Chairman called attention to amendments requested during testimony on January 29. Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) requested changing the effective date to state from and after its publication in the Kansas register. The law has to be in effect by June 30, 2009 in order to receive the \$11.2 million federal incentive money. The next amendment was requested by Kathy Porter from the Office of Judicial Administration, adding the statutory docket fee for safety belt violations.

Senator Peterson had requested a maximum warning period and that the fine include the docket fee. Terry Heidner, KDOT, clarified the grace period allowance. The bill has to be in affect by June 30 but warning tickets can be issued until September 29, 2009. Discussion followed and the Chairman indicated to wait for action on this warning period amendment until exact language is drafted.

Senator Umbarger turned attention to the issue of the docket fee. After questions and discussion, Senator Brownlee proposed \$25 fine plus the docket fee of \$75. Senator Kultala moved, Senator Brownlee seconded, to amend **SB 59** as indicated. Motion carried.

The Chairman called for continued action on **SB 37 -Regarding traffic, concerning golf carts**.

Mike Corrigan continued review of the substitute bill draft and the slow moving vehicle emblem amendment (<u>Attachment 2</u>). Discussion followed and the committee indicated concern that the original bill was not included in the substitute bill. <u>Senator Petersen moved</u>, <u>Senator Apple seconded</u>, to adopt the slow moving vehicle emblem amendment into the original **SB 37** language. <u>Motion carried</u>.

Senator Schmidt moved, Senator Brownlee seconded, to merge the original amended SB 37 into the substitute bill draft. Motion carried.

The Chairman indicated the committee would consider final action after review of the new bill language.

The meeting was adjourned at 09:27 a.m. The next meeting is scheduled for February 17, 2009.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is effective as of the 12th day of February, 2009, by and between MID-STATES PORT AUTHORITY, a quasi-municipal Kansas entity ("MSPA") and KYLE RAILROAD COMPANY, a Kansas corporation ("Kyle").

WHEREAS, MSPA and Kyle, on April 30, 1984, entered into a certain "Agreement", by the terms of which MSPA agreed to convey certain real property and improvements to Kyle upon the satisfaction of certain conditions; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to complete the performance of the Agreement as required thereunder; and

WHEREAS, an issue has arisen concerning the effect a 1987 amendment to K.S.A. 12-3412 has on the terms of the conveyance under the Agreement, and legislation has been proposed in the Kansas Legislature ("SB 46") to remove such issue and allow the conveyance to take place pursuant to the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the parties agree that if SB 46 is adopted in substantially the form currently proposed, they will complete the performance of the Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, based on these premises and the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties hereby agree as follows:

- 1. That in the event that SB 46 is adopted by the Kansas Legislature and signed into law by the Governor of Kansas in substantially the form currently proposed, they waive the right to seek a judicial determination of the validity of the Agreement.
- 2. In addition to the requirements of the Agreement, at the closing of the aforesaid conveyance, Kyle shall honor all term extensions of leases that have been made known to Kyle, as per the listing attached hereto as Exhibit A, and all rent adjustments and other lease terms made in accordance with the three templates that MSPA used as its standard forms, said templates having been provided by MSPA to Kyle. MSPA confirms that it has not granted any options to purchase to tenants associated with the leases described in Exhibit A.
- 3. MSPA acknowledges by this agreement that Kyle's purchase option has been exercised pursuant to Section 4 of the Agreement.

AN ACT regulating traffic; concerning golf carts; amending K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 8-126, 8-128, 8-1486 and 8-2118 and repealing the existing sections.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

New Section 1. "Golf cart" means a motor vehicle that has not less than three wheels in contact with the ground, an unladen weight of not more than 1,800 pounds, is designed to be and is operated at not more than 25 miles per hour and is designed to carry not more than four persons including the driver.

New Sec. 2. (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a golf cart: (1) On any interstate highway, federal highway or state highway; (2) on any public highway or street within the corporate limits of any city unless authorized by such city; or (3) on any street or highway with a posted speed limit greater than 30 miles per hour.

- (b) The provisions of subsection (a) shall not prohibit a golf cart from crossing a federal or state highway or a street or highway with a posted speed limit in excess of 30 miles per hour.
- (c) A golf cart operated on any public street or highway shall be equipped with efficient brakes, brake lights, reliable steering apparatus, rearview mirror, red reflectorized warning devices in both the front and reanand turn signal equipment.
- (d) A golf cart shall be operated on any public street or highway only during the hours between sunrise and sunset.
- (e) This section shall be part of and supplemental to the uniform act regulating traffic on highways.
- Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 8-126 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8-126. The following words and phrases when used in this act shall have the meanings respectively ascribed to them herein:
- (a) "Vehicle" means every device in, upon or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a public highway, excepting electric personal assistive mobility devices or devices moved by human power or used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks.
- (b) "Motor vehicle" means every vehicle, other than a motorized bicycle or a motorized wheelchair, which is self-propelled.
