MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMERCE COMMITTEE

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Karin Brownlee at 8:30 a.m. on March 3, 2010, in Room 548-S of the Capitol.

Three confirmations are scheduled for hearing on this date. Chairperson Brownlee asked Mr. Thornton to be the first conferee and to make statements about his qualifications to be Secretary of Commerce and what his goals would be in that position.

Mr. Thornton is from Atchison, Kansas. He has a Juris Doctor degree from Washburn School of Law and has been a practicing attorney. He has received a number of honors and awards and currently serves on several boards of directors for Kansas organizations.

Mr. Thornton believes the time he has spent as Acting Secretary of Commerce has helped him prepare for the position of Secretary of Commerce. He had an opportunity to see what the Commerce Department is doing and evaluate what needs to be done for the future. He has taken the opportunity to visit with each individual employee of the Commerce Department and finds that the employees love their jobs, have a passion to serve, and are very competent in their jobs. He believes he has a good team to work with. One of the things he has done since being in the Department has been to work on individual strategies for the five divisions of the department and an overall strategy for the whole department. This positions Commerce to plan for good things to happen and not just react to things that do happen. He believes that things you plan to happen will happen. In strategic planning, he is working on what Commerce should be in three to five years from now. He is working especially on Workforce since that is the one area that helps with jobs. He also wants to make sure that the dollars spent are an investment and there will be a return on that investment. Mr. Thornton believes his own personal experiences in looking for jobs will be an asset for him and he appreciates what Kansans are going through in the job market and wants the Workforce Division to be helpful to people. Commerce is challenged to help people find jobs in the urban areas, but in western Kansas, the challenge is to find enough workers for the jobs available. Through the Pipeline and other programs, Commerce wants to encourage people to come back to Kansas and wants to market the communities where people are needed for jobs. Travel and tourism has a great return on investment; \$90 for every dollar spent. Tourism has an opportunity to show Kansas differently to make Kansas a destination place. Tourism is working with rural and small communities to promote their activities. Another challenge for Commerce is to identify potential businesses from around the world that could come to Kansas. All of these areas are part of an opportunity to develop strategies that the Commerce Department can capitalize on, and Mr. Thornton is excited to be a part of this.

Chairperson Brownlee said she appreciated that Mr. Thornton was planning for 3-5 years down the road although he didn't know what would happen even in the next year or two, it is good to have a long term perspective. She agrees with Mr. Thornton that there is a great team in Commerce because whenever she hears about organizations or companies recruited to come to Kansas, Kansas has quickly responded to these groups which has made a big difference.

Senator Reitz applauds the efforts to keep people returning to Kansas to work and agrees with the ideas to do more with tourism and to trumpet the people who are significant to Kansas. Mr. Thornton responded that is

why he thought it very important to strategize future plans - that the department would do what it can now under monetary restraints, but to be ready with bigger ideas for Kansas for the future when times are more generous.

Senator Schodorf remarked that Mr. Thornton really had a vision for Kansas and what we are and what we can be. She thought Mr. Thornton was a very fast learner because it was difficult coming in to the department cold and he has grasped everything and knows where he wants to go and she appreciates that very much. (Attachment 1)

Senator Schodorf moved that the committee recommend confirmation of William Thornton to be Secretary of Commerce and forward that recommendation to the Senate. Seconded by Senator Reitz and Senator Holland. Motion carried.

Chairperson welcomed Dr. Steven F. Warren who has been nominated as a Member of the Kansas Technology Corporation Board and ask him about his background, what he would like to accomplish on the board, what his goals would be, and how he might contribute to the reorganization of the board.

Mr. Warren is Vice Provost for Research and Graduate Studies at the University of Kansas. He has an extensive background in Human Ecology, mental health and developmental disabilities The economic development mission in his department is that students be put out into the workforce in the state of Kansas. Also his department has become aggressive in the last decade so their economic development issues are in terms of building businesses, starting new businesses, all kinds of ways to create a foundation for the future of the economy. Mr. Warren has been very involved in these things and he sees his work as very similar to the mission of KTEC. The KTEC board has been tested and there have been changes in the board, and he feels the KTEC board is now very engaged. From his observation, Kevin Carr is doing a remarkable job for KTEC in midst of a crisis. The board is trying to move forward in their economic mission with less money. That focuses the mind on what you can do to contribute. He believes his experiences in economic development at KU in the last few years will make him a strong member of the KTEC board.

Senator Lynn remarked she is very impressed with Dr. Warren's work with mental health and disabilities and would like to know how he will translate that work into economic development specifically to the workforce. Mr. Warren replied that work covers a lot of things, but part of it is to build industries in Kansas that, in the global world we are in, represents high technology, high paying jobs, the essence of creation. Senator Lynn is interested in how his background will help the world of young people and middle age people who have certain skill levels that might be applied. It is an important economic value that those individuals might bring to the table and she hopes that Dr. Warren could work with the KTEC board in making sure that population is represented and something of value could be produced for them in the workplace. Dr. Warren agrees with her concern. (Attachment 2)

Senator Lynn moved that Dr. Steven F. Warren be approved for confirmation to the KTEC board by this committee. Senator Emler seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Audrey Langworthy has been nominated for re-appointment to the Kansas Development Finance Authority Board. Mrs. Langworthy, although not required, was invited to appear before the committee but was not available. (Attachment 3)

Senator Emler moved that Audrey Langworthy be approved for confirmation to the KDFA Board. Motion seconded by Senator Wagle. Motion carried.

The next meeting is scheduled for March 4, 2010.

The meeting was adjourned at 09:20 a.m.




