**HB 2386 - Veterinary school students; spaying or neutering dogs and cats; animal shelters**

Chairman Aurand told committee we were going to work HB 2386.

Eunice Peters, Office of the Revisor of Statutes, explained to the committee the amendment to this bill. (Attachment 1)

**Representative Colloton moved to adopt the amendment to HB 2386. It was seconded by Representative Howell. Motion carried.**

**Representative Loganbill moved to amend Section 3, Line 15. Publication in Register. It was seconded by Representative Osterman. Motion carried.**

**Representative Colloton moved to pass out HB 2386 as amended. It was seconded by Representative Scapa. Motion carried.**

**SB 11 - Authorizing transportation of students residing on Fort Leavenworth military reservation**

**Chairman Aurand moved to include HB 2004 as passed on the House to SB 11. It was seconded by Representative Colloton. Motion carried.**

**Representative Spalding moved to amend SB 11 regarding only transportation count on SB 11. (Attachment 2). It was seconded by Representative Osterman. Motion carried.**

**Representative Spalding moved to pass out SB 11 amended. It was seconded by Representative Scapa. Motion carried.**

**HCR 5010 - School finance; equitable distribution of public school funds in the amount and manner determined by the legislature**

Eunice Peters, Office of the Revisor of Statutes explained to the committee the amendment to **HCR 5010**. (Attachment 3)

A question and answer session followed Ms. Peters' explanation.

Chairman Aurand explained to the committee that not enough people were present to vote on this bill. He advised the committee to keep it close because we might meet briefly next week to vote on **HCR 5010**.

## HOUSE BILL No. 2386

By Committee on Federal and State Affairs

3-11

1 AN ACT concerning animal shelters; amending K.S.A. 47-1731 and  
2 repealing the existing section.

3  
4 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

5 Section 1. K.S.A. 47-1731 is hereby amended to read as follows: 47-  
6 1731. (a) No dog or cat may be transferred to the permanent custody of a  
7 prospective owner by a pound or animal shelter, as defined by K.S.A. 47-  
8 1701, and amendments thereto, or by a humane society, unless:

9 (1) Such dog or cat has been surgically spayed or neutered before  
10 the physical transfer of the animal occurs; or

11 (2) the prospective owner signs an agreement to have the dog or cat  
12 spayed or neutered and deposits with the pound or animal shelter funds  
13 not less than the lowest nor more than the highest cost of spaying or  
14 neutering in the community. Any funds deposited pursuant to such an  
15 agreement shall be refunded to such person upon presentation of a written  
16 statement signed by a licensed veterinarian that the dog or cat has been  
17 spayed or neutered. If such person does not reclaim the deposit within six  
18 months after receiving custody of the animal, the pound or animal shelter  
19 shall keep the deposit and may reclaim the unspayed or unneutered  
20 animal.

21 (b) No person shall spay or neuter any dog or cat for or on behalf of  
22 a pound or animal shelter unless such person is a licensed veterinarian or  
23 a student currently enrolled in the college of veterinary medicine, Kansas  
24 state university, who has completed at least two years of study in the  
25 veterinary medical curriculum and is participating in a spay or neuter  
26 program as part of the curriculum under the direct supervision of a  
27 licensed veterinarian ~~who is a faculty member at the Kansas state~~  
28 ~~university veterinary medical center. The spay or neuter program shall~~  
29 ~~only be conducted at the surgery clinic at the Kansas state university~~  
30 ~~medical center in Manhattan, Kansas.~~ No pound or animal shelter shall  
31 designate the veterinarian which a person must use, or a list from which a  
32 person must select a veterinarian, to spay or neuter a dog or cat  
33 transferred by such person from such pound or animal shelter. Any  
34 premises located in the state of Kansas where the spaying, neutering or  
any other practice of veterinary medicine occurs shall register such  
premises with the board of veterinary examiners.

6 (d) Nothing in this section shall be construed to require sterilization  
7 of a dog or cat which is being held by a pound or animal shelter and  
8 which may be claimed by its rightful owner within the holding period  
9 established in K.S.A. 47-1710, and amendments thereto.

10 (e) The livestock commissioner shall promulgate rules and  
11 regulations as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this  
12 section.

## House Concurrent Resolution No. 5010

By Committee on Education

2-8

1 A PROPOSITION to amend section 6 of article 6 of the constitution of  
2 the state of Kansas; relating to school finance.

3  
4 *Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Kansas, two-thirds of*  
5 *the members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the House of*  
6 *Representatives and two-thirds of the members elected (or appointed)*  
7 *and qualified to the Senate concurring therein:*

8 Section 1. The following proposition to amend the constitution of  
9 the state of Kansas shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the state  
10 for their approval or rejection: Section 6 of article 6 of the constitution  
11 of the state of Kansas is hereby amended to read as follows:

12 "§ 6. Finance. (a) The legislature may levy a permanent tax  
13 for the use and benefit of state institutions of higher education and  
14 apportion among and appropriate the same to the several  
15 institutions, which levy, apportionment and appropriation shall  
16 continue until changed by statute. Further appropriation and other  
17 provision for finance of institutions of higher education may be  
18 made by the legislature.

19 (b) The legislature shall ~~make suitable provision provide for~~  
20 ~~finance of the educational interests of the state the equitable~~  
21 ~~distribution of public school funds in a manner and amount as may~~  
22 ~~be determined by the legislature. make suitable provision for~~  
23 ~~finance of the educational interests of the state in an equitable~~  
24 ~~manner and in such amounts as may be determined by the~~  
25 ~~legislature.~~

26 (c) No tuition shall be charged for attendance at any public  
27 school to pupils required by law to attend such school, except such  
28 fees or supplemental charges as may be authorized by law. The  
29 legislature may authorize the state board of regents to establish  
30 tuition, fees and charges at institutions under its supervision.

31 ~~(e)~~(d) No religious sect or sects shall control any part of the  
32 public educational funds."

16 Sec. 3. This resolution, if approved by two-thirds of the members  
17 elected (or appointed) and qualified to the House of Representatives, and  
18 two-thirds of the members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the  
19 Senate shall be entered on the journals, together with the yeas and nays.  
20 The secretary of state shall cause this resolution to be published as  
21 provided by law and shall cause the proposed amendment to be submitted  
22 to the electors of the state at the general election in November in the year  
23 2012 unless a special election is called at a sooner date by concurrent  
24 resolution of the legislature, in which case it shall be submitted to the  
25 electors of the state at the special election.
