#### MINUTES OF THE SENATE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Carolyn McGinn at 12:45 p.m. on March 23, 2011, in Room 548-S of the Capitol.

#### **Confirmation Hearing**

Senator McGinn opened the confirmation hearing for Robert Siedlecki for the position of Secretary of the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services (SRS).

Acting Secretary Siedlecki opened with comments concerning his past professional experience, his educational background, and his involvement with various national and community non-profit organizations (Attachment 1).

Senator McGinn requested that Mr. Siedlecki expand on his experience/background in areas of social services, aging, Medicaid/Medicare, etc. Mr. Siedlecki indicated the Florida Department of Health was comprised of 67 county health departments. The funding structure consisted of 50 percent uninsured, 40 percent Medicaid insured, and 10 percent paying clients. Since relocating to Kansas as Acting SRS Secretary, he described his involvement with the subcabinet working with Lieutenant Governor Colyer, Robert Moser, MD, Secretary of Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE), Andy Allison, PhD, Division of Healthcare Finance (in KDHE), and other Secretaries concentrating on health care and Medicaid issues in Kansas. He expressed his commitment to undertaking innovative solutions, increasing choice, and reducing the cost of care.

Senator Teichman inquired what successes and concerns Acting Secretary Siedlecki had experienced in Florida. Mr. Siedlecki indicated that Florida had experienced serious budget challenges. During his employment at the Department of Health, he:

- streamlined operations at the agency resulting in a decrease from 21,000 to 17,000 employees, and
- initiated Medicaid reforms to ensure services were provided without raising costs.

#### In Washington, he:

- launched an "Adopt US Kids" website in 2003 to increase adoptions, and
- focused on a Healthy Father initiative to support children and families.

Mr. Siedlecki commented that whether at the state or federal level, the budget is always an issue. Collaboration among all stakeholders is essential to ensure the most vulnerable are served. He emphasized the necessity of greater centralization and communication to maximize efficiencies that result in desired outcomes with existing resources.

Unless specifically noted, the individual remarks recorded herein have not been transcribed verbatim. Individual remarks as reported herein have not been submitted to the individuals appearing before the committee for editing or corrections. 1

Senator Schodorf spoke about SRS' involvement in protective custody of children not only in Sedgwick County but also throughout the state. She asked Acting Secretary Siedlecki to comment on this issue. Mr. Siedlecki responded that this issue is one of balance that incorporates flexibility to deal with individual circumstances while maintaining consistency in actions. He pointed to the importance of oversight, the importance of following the standard included in policies/procedures and protocols, and the provision of required remediation to existing standards when they are unmet.

Senator Vratil noted that Mr. Siedlecki focused on flexibility while considering individual circumstances; he asked how Acting Secretary Siedlecki will pursue that philosophy when accusations of favoritism and inconsistent actions arise. Mr. Siedlecki responded that he has requested the Division of Legislative Post Audit to evaluate 10 cases to ensure that like cases were handled consistently. He expressed his willingness to investigate any case to ensure decisions were made correctly.

Senator Vratil inquired who has been assigned the legislative liaison role in SRS. Mr. Siedlecki indicated either he or Gary Haulmark, Governmental Affairs, would respond to legislators' concerns.

Senator Vratil asked how Acting Secretary Siedlecki hopes to reduce expenditures and increase revenue, as he had indicated in his previous comments and inquired how Mr. Siedlecki will deal with the temptation to reduce provider reimbursement rates. Mr. Siedlecki responded that in sub-cabinet meetings, all options are being considered---no option is "off the table." Expanding managed care, looking to the federal government for a super waiver, looking for block grants, and evaluating every possible solution for Medicaid are topics at sub-cabinet meetings. His goal is to provide the same or better services under Medicaid than have been provided in the past.

Senator Vratil referenced a recent e-mail that had been shared among legislators involving a meeting with Acting Secretary Siedlecki and others; Senator Vratil asked Mr. Siedlecki to respond. Acting Secretary Siedlecki indicated that he meets regularly with stakeholders (mental health organizations, disability community providers, and child welfare providers). At a meeting with mental health providers, Mr. Siedlecki discussed the upcoming work on the FY 2013 budget. He discussed with providers the possibility of a 5-10 percent cut, and he asked the providers to determine where the cuts should be. His promise to the providers was that if they determined, accepted, and defended the cuts, he would defend the programs they wanted to retain and the cuts they did not want. He indicated he would abide by that promise with all provider communities. He stated that as an attorney his obligation is to act according to the law, and he promised that all funds under his trust will be used for intended purposes. Mr. Siedlecki stated it was not his intent to misuse funds. Evaluating budget issues requires prioritization and collaboration with involved partners; furthermore, in light of varied interests, the Acting Secretary indicated that his intent would not be to thwart legislative direction.

Senator Huntington asked Acting Secretary Siedlecki to comment on privatizing services. Mr. Siedlecki indicated that, in some instances, privatization or outsourcing can achieve better services and results at a better price. His goal is accountability and performance within the funded programs.

Senator Huntington inquired what programs introduced in Florida were successful in reducing state expenditures and Medicaid dollars. Acting Secretary Siedlecki responded that \$5 million was saved by reducing travel expenses; no travel was considered mandatory. Teleconferencing was used to facilitate meetings. To address Medicaid, a managed care pilot project was implemented in Florida. The project involved collaboration with five county health departments to reduce Medicaid expenditures. It was projected to result in a potential expediture reduction of 2-5 percent within a ten-year period. Utilization was evaluated, and a plan to implement electronic health records was created.

Senator Kelly indicated there was one letter from mental health community providers that supported Acting Secretary Siedlecki's confirmation. She inquired what activity generated that letter of support. Mr. Siedlecki responded that following an open stakeholder meeting to discuss issues/concerns, an individual attending the meeting sent an e-mail reporting that Mr. Siedlecki's plan was to fund his initiatives with reductions from mental health funding. He indicated there

was no link between the mental health providers and his initiatives; he did not state anything, to his knowledge, which would have signaled an intent to misuse apporopriated funds. He indicated his wish to work in partnership with providers, staff, and legislators. One mental health provider representative sent the letter of support

Senator Kelly inquired about the implementation date for Mr. Siedlecki's planned initiatives. Acting Secretary Siedlecki responded there is no implementation date set; much work remains to develop the initiatives, which are in the conceptual phase. The initiatives continue to be created to parallel the Governor's "Roadmap." He indicated there would be nothing implemented before next fiscal year.

Senator Kelly asked how Acting Secretary Siedlecki would achieve a 5-10 percent funding reduction as was discussed in the House Appropriations Committee meeting. Specifically, did Mr. Siedlecki discuss with stakeholders how those cuts would be accommodated or did he suggest how he would incorporate those cuts. Acting Secretary Siedlecki reported that if cuts were necessary, SRS would do its part, but he wanted discretion within the agency to determine here these would be taken.

Senator Kelly reported that in the Senate Ways and Means Committee last week, foster care contracts were discussed, and Mr. Siedlecki had assured Senators that he had no intention of opening those contracts. Acting Secretary Siedlecki responded that he wouldn't make any changes to contracts. Senator Kelly reiterated her understanding that Mr. Siedlecki would not open the contracts to make changes. Mr. Siedlecki indicated a contract would have to be opened to make a contract modification on the issue of price. Senator Kelly inquired about a conversation in the House of Representatives. Mr. Siedlecki reported he had no knowledge of any such conversation.

Senator Kelly indicated that according to the SRS organizational chart, two positions had been added. Mr. Siedlecki indicated Jeff Kahrs has been added to the position of Chief of Staff. In addition, an Ombudsman will be hired to assist Gary Haulmark. This leaves the agency within the allocated budget. Senator Kelly asked if there was a new position under Ray Dalton. Mr. Siedlecki responded that there was no new position. Senator Kelly replied that upon review of the job descriptions of Mr. Dalton and his special assistant, it was difficult to differentiate one from the other. Senator Kelly commented that Mr. Siedlecki has communicated (in the past) concerning the goal of streamlining agencies, and it was disheartening to see an agency expand before programs are in place.

Senator Kelly acknowledged the budget challenge facing Kansas and asked why Mr. Siedlecki's compensation is more than any other cabinet Secretary. Mr. Siedlecki indicated that he was taking a 6.5 percent pay reduction (from his previous employment), Florida has no income tax or automobile personal property tax, and sales tax is higher. He indicated his experience and knowledge may have contributed to his compensation package.

Senator McGinn asked if positions in the field have been eliminated. Mr. Siedlecki indicated that 6-7 employees were eliminated following their probationary period, and two positions were eliminated at the administrative level to accommodate the addition of the Chief of Staff and Ombudsman positions.

Senator Kelly asked about voucher programs and how they work. Responding to these questions, Acting Secretary Siedlecki indicated:

- preferred providers are selected based on pre-defined qualifications and are usually contracted at a lower rate than those outside of the program,
- faith-based or secular providers can be included in the program,
- the individual requiring services is provided a voucher and a list of providers,
- the individual requiring services can choose among preferred providers or providers outside of the program,
- if the individual does not choose among preferred providers, the reimbursement provided is directly paid to the provider,
- the system is designed to save dollars and increase consumer choice, and

 quality of care oversight is provided by monitoring services that includes a dashboard for performance measurement.

Senator Francisco expressed concern that in her county, jails are perceived as alternatives to inadequate community-based mental health services. Further, providing for appropriate treatment for inmates with mental disorders is a task for which most facilities are ill equipped. She inquired how Acting Secretary Siedlecki visualizes savings and the provision of services outside of the usual SRS setting. Mr. Siedlecki replied that the key and goal is collaboration with providers and all stakeholders to develop solutions that will exceed expectations.

Senator Vratil discussed SB 21--School districts; use of funds from tax levies on motor vehicles and recreational vehicles with committee members. He reported this bill passed in the 2010 Session 39-1 and passed again this year 38-0. Currently, it appears to be in a House committee with no action planned. Senator Vratil moved to delete the contents of HB 2158, to insert the contents of SB 21 and to pass out as Senate Substitute for HB 2158. Senator Schodorf seconded the motion, which passed on a voice vote.

Chairperson McGinn announced the Acting Secretary Siedlecki's confirmation hearing would be continued next week. The announcement of time and date would be in the Senate chamber.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:35 p.m.

- 8. The right not to be used as a confidant regarding the legal proceedings between the parents.

- 10. The right to choose not to express certain feelings.
- 11. The right to be protected from parental warfare.
- 12. The right not to be made to feel guilty for loving both parents.
