Bill Introductions

Senator Emler discussed introduction of a bill (#rs1329) concerning the Kansas Bioscience Authority and its governance under an eleven-member board. Senator Emler moved to delete the provisions of HB 2357 and to substitute the provisions of the bill discussed (#rs1329) (Attachment 1) and to pass out favorably S. Sub for HB 2357. Senator Kelly seconded the motion, which carried on a voice vote.

As a point of information, Senator Huntington noted that Dr. Ray Smilor is the current KTEC appointment to the KBA. He recently moved from California where he served as the former president of the Foundation for Enterprise Development. Dr. Smilor currently is the Vice President for the Kauffman Center for Entrepreneurial Leadership in Kansas City, Missouri.

Senator Kelly moved introduction of a bill (#rs1299) that decouples Kansas tax law from federal tax law. Senator Kultala seconded the motion, which carried on a voice vote.

HB 2336 - Kansas Employment First Initiative Act; Persons with Disabilities

Daniel Yoza, Office of the Revisor of Statutes, briefed committee members on <u>HB 2336</u> (<u>Attachment 2</u>) He noted <u>SB 205</u> was heard in Senate Ways and Means on March 14, 2011; there was no action taken. At the time of introduction, <u>SB 205 and HB 2336</u> were identical. The House bill was amended to revise the mission statement and to clarify that the bill contains no hiring preferences for disabled persons. <u>HB 2336</u>, as amended, also deleted the portion of the bill providing for an Oversight Commission and replaced the commission with a lead cabinet agency.

Senator Vratil offered an amendment (<u>Attachment 3</u>) to <u>HB 2336</u> defining the terms, "competitive employment" and "integrated setting." In addition, Senator Vratil's proposed amendment restores the Oversight Commission into the bill. Senator Vratil elaborated that any Oversight Commission activities would be funded by existing grants and resources. <u>Senator Vratil moved passage of the amendment discussed</u>. <u>Senator Kelly seconded the motion</u>, which carried on a voice vote.

Considerable discussion followed concerning the Oversight Commission being assigned to a subcabinet agency (in the amended bill) instead of the Social and Rehabilitation Services agency (in the originally drafted bill).

Senator Vratil moved passage of **HB 2336** as amended. Senator Schodorf seconded the motion, which passed on a voice vote.

<u>SB 240 – Abolishing the joint committee on information technology; creating the committee on technology oversight</u>

Daniel Yoza, Office of the Revisor of Statutes, briefed committee members on <u>SB 240</u> (<u>Attachment 4</u>). This bill abolishes the Joint Committee on Information Technology (JCIT) and replaces it with a Committee on Technology Oversight. Mr. Yoza described the committee's membership, duties, and functions.

Committee members compared the proposed Committee on Technology Oversight contained in <u>SB 240</u> to the current JCIT process. While many functions and duties of the new committee mirror those of JCIT, the new committee would be unable to introduce legislation. In addition, the Committee on Technology Oversight would include three members from the information technology industry, who would be non-legislators. Members discussed the value of reconfiguring committee membership to include information technology (IT) experts. Senator Francisco expressed concern relating to the Oversight Committee's ability to integrate policy, project, and budget recommendations into the actual successful implementation of decisions and systems. Senator Umbarger suggested that expanding the reporting process of the chief information technology officer not only to the Oversight Committee but also to the Legislative Coordinating Council (LCC) would enhance communication. Senator Umbarger moved to add language in SB 240 that the chief information technology officer includes the LCC in any reporting processes. Senator Kelly seconded the motion, which carried on a voice vote.

<u>Senator Vratil moved to pass out **SB 240** as amended. Senator Teichman seconded the motion, which carried on a voice vote.</u>

Appointment of Terry Matlack to the Kansas Public Employees' Retirement System Board of Trustees for a term of four years

Under the provisions in KSA 46-2201, the Joint committee on Pensions, Investments and Benefits is accountable to recommend to the standing Senate Ways and Means Committee any appointment of a member to the Public Employees Retirement System Board of Trustees. Representative Sharon Schwartz, Chairperson of the Joint Committee on Pensions, Investments and Benefits, notified Senator McGinn that the Joint Committee met at 12:30 p.m. on May 2, 2011, to consider the appointment of Terry Matlack (<u>Attachment 5</u>). The Joint Committee heard testimony from Mr. Matlack and voted to recommend Mr. Matlack's appointment to the Senate Ways and Means Committee.

Senators discussed Mr. Matlack's appointment and reviewed his Senate Confirmation Information Summary (<u>Attachment 6</u>), which was previously distributed to committee members on April 28, 2011. <u>Senator Teichman moved to recommend confirmation to the Senate Committee of the Whole the appointment of Terry Matlack to the Kansas Public Employees' Retirement System Board of Trustees. <u>Senator Masterson seconded the motion, which carried on a voice vote.</u></u>

Minutes of the April 20, 2011, Senate Ways and Means Committee meeting

Senator Schodorf moved to approve the minutes of the April 20, 2011, meeting. Senator Emler seconded the motion, which carried on a voice vote.

Omnibus Bill

Senator McGinn distributed a spreadsheet for Senators' review that outlined differences between the House and Senate positions on Omnibus issues. It was noted the spreadsheet is up-to-date as of May 4 (Attachment 7). Chairperson McGinn encouraged review of the information.

Senator Huntington remarked that there appears to be no movement in the House to consider a fee increase for funding the Ethics Commission. Consequently, funding the Ethics Commission is possible for Omnibus action.

Senator McGinn adjourned the meeting at 12:04 p.m.

AN ACT concerning to Kansas bioscience authority; relating to membership thereof; amending K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-99b04 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-99b04 is hereby amended to read as follows: 74-99b04. (a) There is hereby established a body politic and corporate, with corporate succession, to be known as the Kansas bioscience authority. The authority shall be an independent instrumentality of the state. Its exercise of the rights, powers and privileges conferred by this act shall be deemed and held to be the performance of an essential governmental function.

- (b) In order to accelerate any and all synergy and opportunities for the growth of the authority, the authority shall be headquartered and establish its principal operation in the county in the state with the highest number of bioscience employees associated with bioscience companies as of the effective date of this act. The exact location of the authority's headquarters and principal operations in such county shall be at the discretion of the authority's board.
- (c) The authority shall be governed by an eleven-member board. One member of the board shall be an agricultural expert who is recognized for outstanding knowledge and leadership in the field of bioscience. Eight of the members of the board shall be representatives of the general public who are recognized for outstanding knowledge and leadership in the fields of finance, business, bioscience research, plant biotechnology, basic research, health care, legal affairs, bioscience manufacturing or product commercialization, education or government. Of the nine voting members, five must be residents of the state. The other two members of the board shall be nonvoting members with research expertise representing state universities and shall be appointed by the Kansas board of regents. Nonvoting members shall serve at the pleasure of the

board of regents.

- Of the nine voting members who will be appointed to the authority's first board, two shall be appointed by the governor for a term of office of four years, two shall be appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives, one of which shall be the agricultural expert as authorized in subsection (c), for a term of office of three years, two shall be appointed by the president of the senate for a term of office of three years, one shall be appointed by the minority leader of the house of representatives for a term of office of two years, one shall be appointed by the minority leader of the senate for a term of office of two years, and one shall be appointed by the Kansas technology enterprise corporation for a term of office of one year. Members of the first board shall be appointed by August 1, 2004 the secretary of commerce. No more than three voting members shall be appointed from any one congressional district. All voting members of the board shall be subject to senate confirmation as provided in K.S.A. 75-4315b and amendments thereto. Any member of the board whose nomination is subject to confirmation during a regular session of the legislature shall be deemed terminated when the senate rejects the nomination. No such termination shall affect the validity of any action taken by such member of the board before such termination.
- (e) Terms of voting members appointed pursuant to this section shall expire on March 15.
- (f) After the expiration of the terms of the authority's first board, or Whenever a vacancy occurs or is announced regarding a voting member or members of the board, such voting member or members shall be appointed as described in subsections (c) and (d), except that such members shall be appointed for terms of four years each. In the event of a vacancy the

appointment shall be for the remainder of the unexpired portion of the term. Each member of the board shall hold office for the term of appointment and until a successor has been confirmed. Any member of the board is eligible for reappointment, but members of the board shall not be eligible to serve more than three consecutive four-year terms.

- (g) Except for appointments of nonvoting members, each appointment shall be forwarded to the senate for confirmation as provided in K.S.A. 75-4315b, and amendments thereto. Except as provided by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 46-2601, and amendments thereto, no person appointed to the board shall exercise any power, duty or function as a member of the board until confirmed by the senate. In case of a vacancy when the senate is not in session, the appointing entity may make a temporary appointment to the board until the next meeting of the senate. Any person who is temporarily appointed by the appointing entity to the board shall have all of the powers, duties and functions as a member of the board during such temporary appointment.
- (h) The board annually shall elect a voting member as chairperson and at least one other as vice-chairperson. The board also shall elect a secretary and treasurer for terms to be determined by the board. The board may elect the same person to serve as both secretary and treasurer. The board shall establish an executive committee, nominating committee and other standing or special committees, and prescribe their duties and powers. Any executive committee of the board may exercise all such powers and duties of the board as the board may delegate.
- (i) Members of the board are entitled to compensation and expenses as provided in K.S.A. 75-3223, and amendments thereto. Members of the board attending board meetings or subcommittee meetings authorized by the board, shall be paid mileage and all other applicable expenses, provided such expenses are consistent with policies established from time-to-time by

the board and as required by subsection (k) (j).

- (j) No part of the funds of the authority shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributed to, its employees, officers or members of the board, except that the authority may make reasonable payments for expenses incurred on its behalf relating to any of its lawful purposes and the authority shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered to or for its benefit relating to any of its lawful purposes, including to pay its employees reasonable compensation.
- (k) Any member of the board other than a nonvoting member may be removed by an affirmative vote by six members of the board for malfeasance or misfeasance in office, regularly failing to attend meetings, or for any cause which renders the member incapable of or unfit to discharge the duties of director.
- (I) The board shall meet at least four times per year and at such other times as it deems appropriate, or upon call by the president or the chairperson, or upon written request of a majority of the directors of the board. The board may adopt, repeal and amend such rules, procedures and bylaws, not contrary to law or inconsistent with this act, as it deems expedient for its own governance and for the governance and management of the authority. A majority of the total voting membership of the board shall constitute a quorum for meetings. The board may act by a majority of those at any meeting where a quorum is present, except upon such issues as the board may determine shall require a vote of six members of the board for approval. The board shall meet for the initial meeting upon call by the member of the board appointed by the Kansas technology enterprise corporation, who shall act as temporary chairperson until officers of the board are elected pursuant to subsection (i).

- (m) The board shall appoint a president who shall serve at the pleasure of the board. The president shall serve as the chief executive officer of the authority. The president's salary shall be set by the board. The board may negotiate and enter into an employment agreement with the individual selected as president of the authority, which may provide for compensation allowances, benefits and expenses as may be included in such agreement. The president shall direct and supervise administrative affairs and the general management of the authority.
- (n) The board may provide supplemental benefits to the president and other authority employees designated by the board in addition to the benefits provided under this act.
- (o) The authority shall continue until terminated by law, except that no such law shall take effect so long as the authority has debts or obligations outstanding, unless adequate provision has been made for the payment or retirement of such debts or obligations. Upon any such dissolution of the authority, all property, funds and assets thereof shall be vested in the state, bioscience research institutions or both as designated by the board, or any other public institute or private enterprise engaged in the business of bioscience, or any combination thereof, as designated by the board and approved by act of the legislature.
 - Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-99b04 is hereby repealed.
- Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.

SB 205

The Senate committee on ways and means held a hearing for Senate bill 205 on March 14, 2011. This bill establishes the Kansas employment first initiative act. It declares the public policy of Kansas to be that competitive and integrated employment shall be the first option when serving people with disabilities. Section 2 directs state agencies to coordinate efforts, collaborate and share information in order to ensure that all state programs, policies, procedures and funding support competitive and integrated employment for people with disabilities. Section 3 establishes the Kansas employment first oversight commission. The commission consists of 5 members, each serving 2 year terms. Four members of the commission will be people with disabilities, who are not state employees. Of these 4 members, one will be appointed by the speaker of the house, one will be appointed by the minority leader of the house, one will be appointed by the governor.

The commission will meet at least 4 times per year. Each member of the commission will be paid mileage and expenses pursuant to K.S.A. 75-3212. The commission is charged with the duty of establishing measurable goals and objectives to implement the employment first initiative act and will track progress towards these goals. The commission will issue an annual report on the progress of the implementation of the act. The department of Social and Rehabilitation services is designated as the lead agency responsible for compiling data and preparing the report at the direction of the commission. The commission will sunset on July 1, 2014.

HB 2336

As introduced, SB 205 and SB 2336 were identical. The house committee on commerce and economic development amended the bill to change the mission statement from "support the employment" to "provide services and support to help obtain employment" of disabled persons. The mission statement was also amended to clarify that this bill does not provide preferences for disabled persons. The house committee also deleted the portion of the bill providing for the oversight commission, replacing the oversight commission with a lead cabinet agency, designated by the governor to implement the employment first initiative. The lead agency is charged with the duty of reporting to ways and means and appropriations regarding the implementation of the employment first act. There was one minor technical amendment on the floor, simply updating the title. It passed the house 124-0.

AN ACT establishing the Kansas employment first initiative act and creating the Kansas employment first oversight commission. and creating the Kansas employment first oversight commission.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

- Section 1. (a) This act shall be known as and cited as the Kansas employment first initiative act. *As used in this act:*
- (1) Competitive employment means work: In the competitive labor market that is performed on a full-time or part-time basis in an integrated setting; and for which an individual is compensated at or above the minimum wage, but not less than the customary wage and level of benefits paid by the employer for the same or similar work performed by individuals who are not disabled. 34 CFR 361.5(b)(11)
- (2) Integrated setting means: With respect to an employment outcome, means a setting typically found in the community in which applicants or eligible individuals interact with non-disabled individuals, other than non-disabled individuals who are providing services to those applicants or eligible individuals, to the same extent that non-disabled individuals in comparable positions interact with other persons. 34 CFR 361.5(b)(33)(ii)
- (b) It is hereby declared to be the policy of the state of Kansas that competitive and integrated employment shall be considered its first option when serving persons with disabilities who are of working age to obtain employment for state employment and for those entities that contract with state agencies to provide employment for persons with a disability. This policy applies to programs and services that support the employment of provide services and support to help obtain employment for persons with disabilities. All state agencies shall follow this policy and ensure that it is effectively implemented in their programs and services. Nothing in this section shall be construed to require any employer to give preference to hiring people with a disability.
- Sec. 2. (a) All state agencies shall coordinate efforts and shall collaborate within and among such agencies to ensure that state programs, policies, procedures and funding support competitive and integrated

employment of individuals with disabilities. All state agencies shall, whenever feasible, share data and information across systems in order to track progress toward full implementation of the act.

- (b) State agencies are authorized to adopt rules and regulations to implement this act.
- Sec. 3.— (a) There is hereby established a Kansas employment first oversight commission consisting of five members. The commission shall consist of the following members who shall serve for a two-year term:
- (1) Four members who are persons with a disability or who are knowledgeable of disability issues and who are not state employees, of whom:
- (A) One shall be appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives;
- (B)—one shall be appointed by the minority leader of the house of representatives:
 - (C) one shall be appointed by the president of the senate; and
 - (D) one shall be appointed by the minority leader of the senate;

All state agencies shall fully cooperate with and provide data and information necessary to assist the lead agency in carrying out its duties.

- (b) The lead agency designated by the governor shall issue an annual report on or before January 30 each year which shall be presented to the governor and to the chairperson of each of the senate committee on ways and means and the house committee on appropriations. The report shall detail progress toward the goals and objectives and full implementation of this act. The report also shall identify barriers to achieving the outcomes along with the effective strategies and policies that can help realize the employment first initiative. The lead agency shall be responsible for compiling data and coordinating the preparation of the annual report. All state agencies shall cooperate with the lead agency on the creation and dissemination of the annual report.
- Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.

Senate bill 240

Senate bill 240 abolishes the Joint committee on information technology (JCIT) and replaces it with a committee on technology oversight. The current JCIT has ten members while the committee on technology oversight would have only seven. The current JCIT has five members appointed from each house, while the committee on technology oversight would have two members appointed from each house and three non-legislator members who are leaders of the information technology industry. The legislator members will be appointed by the president of the senate, the minority leader of the senate, the speaker of the house and the minority leader of the house, respectively. The non-legislator members will be appointed by the speaker of the house, the president of the senate and the governor, respectively.

Most of the duties and functions of the committee on technology oversight are identical to the current JCIT. The committee on technology oversight would not have the ability to introduce bills, as the current JCIT does. However, the committee on technology oversight will still be required to make an annual report to the LCC and any appropriate legislative committees regarding their findings.

The committee on technology oversight will be charged with the duties of examining state agency acquisition of computers and information technologies, review government technology acquisition, make and review 3-year budget plans regarding technology expenditures and study information technology implementation. These duties are identical to duties of the current JCIT.

The amendatory sections of the bill simply clean up references to JCIT, changing them to the committee on technology oversight. This includes K.S.A. 75-7201, which provides that the committee on technology oversight may make a recommendation to the LCC for the position of legislative CITO.

The effective date of the bill is July 1, 2011.

Terry Matlack Brief Biography 5/2/2011

Terry was born in Clearwater, Kansas. Upon graduation from high school, he attended Kansas State University, receiving a degree in Business Administration. He then attended the University of Kansas, receiving both a Masters of Business Administration and a Juris Doctorate. After graduating, Terry worked for approximately 8 years as a Corporate Finance specialist in Investment Banking, first with George K. Baum & Company and then B.C. Christopher, (currently named Oppenheimer). During this period he advised corporations on debt and equity offerings, buyouts and mergers. He then, along with a long time investment banking client, took part in a series of entrepreneurial ventures in the communications sector, forming and financing a cellular company and a cable company, and the purchase and operation of a landline telephone company. 
