CHAPTER 111

SENATE BILL No. 26

AN ACT concerning legal holidays; amending K.S.A. 35-107 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 35-107 is hereby amended to read as follows: 35-107. (a) On and after January 1, 1976 2006, the following days are declared to be legal public holidays and are to be observed as such:

New Year's Day, January 1;

Lincoln's Birthday, the twelfth day in February;

Washington's Birthday, the third Monday in February;

Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, the third Monday in January; President's Day, the third Monday in February;

Memorial Day, the last Monday in May;

Independence Day, July 4;

Labor Day, the first Monday in September;

Columbus Day, the second Monday in October;

Veterans' Day, the eleventh day in November;

Thanksgiving Day, the fourth Thursday in November;

Christmas Day, December 25.

- (b) Any reference in the laws of this state concerning observance of legal holidays shall on and after January 1, 1976 2006, be considered as a reference to the day or days prescribed in subsection (a) hereof for the observance of such legal holiday or holidays.
 - Sec. 2. K.S.A. 35-107 is hereby repealed.
- Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
