SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2101

As Amended by Senate Committee on Federal and State Affairs

Brief*

HB 2101 would amend the Kansas Private Detective Licensing Act to:

- ! Provide that the licenses of private investigators will renew on the anniversary date two years from the date of issuance (rather than all licenses expiring on December 31); and
- ! Set the firearm permit expiration date to be the same as the licensee's private detective license.

The House Committee amended the bill to allow a licensee credit for prior firearms training received under the Kansas Law Enforcement Training Act. The Senate Committee amended the bill to establish a continuing education requirement of 24 hours every two years for license renewal.

Background

HB 2101 was requested as a cleanup measure by the Kansas Bureau of Investigation (KBI). Representatives of the KBI and the Attorney General testified in support of the bill. There were no opponents.

The fiscal note states that passage of the bill will have no fiscal effect and that the agency has no plans to change any fees.
