CONFERENCE COMMITTEE REPORT BRIEF HOUSE BILL NO. 2555

As Agreed to March 30, 2004

Brief *

HB 2555 clarifies that adopted children are included in the exception whereby certain preparers of a will who are related to the person making the will are permitted to receive under the will, up to the amount they would receive under the laws of intestate succession.

Another provision deals with demands against a decedent's estate to require such demand must be made within four months from the date of first notice publication or if the identity of the creditor is known or reasonably ascertainable, 30 days after actual notice was given.

The last change requires that in the case of partial distribution when notice of any probate proceeding is required by law or deemed necessary by the court and the manner of giving it is not directed by law, the court shall order notice to be given to all persons interested, in such a manner and for such length of time as the court considers reasonable.

The Senate Committee deleted the words "or trust" as a technical amendment.

Conference Committee Action

The House Conference Committee concurred with the Senate amendments.
