SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON SENATE BILL NO. 32

As Amended by Senate Committee on Federal and State Affairs

Brief*

SB 32 is a result of the closing of Camptown Greyhound Park in Frontenac in November 2000. The bill would allow the licensee of a racetrack facility that closes to distribute breakage proceeds from live greyhound races to charitable organizations who apply to the organizational licensee. "Breakage" is defined as odd cents by which the amount payable on each dollar wagered exceeds a multiple of \$0.10 for parimutual pools from races.

The Senate Committee amended the bill to provide that this breakage proceeds be given to charities rather than the greyhound owners.

Background

The bill was requested by the Executive Director of the Racing and Gaming Commission.

The fiscal note indicates that the bill has no fiscal impact.
