### SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2614

# As Amended by House Committee on Judiciary

## Brief\*

HB 2614 would increase the salary of district magistrate judges (DMJ) from the current \$33,600 to \$47,416. The bill allows a county or counties comprising a judicial district to supplement the salary of a DMJ who is regularly admitted to practice law in Kansas.

Further, the bill limits the scope of cases that can be heard by a DMJ by removing jurisdiction as a result of a petition or motion requesting termination of parental rights.

## Background

The chief judge of the 10<sup>th</sup> Judicial District appeared in support of the bill, as drafted.

A delegate from the Office of Judicial Administration spoke in opposition to the original bill.

The provision limiting the jurisdiction of a DMJ is taken from HB 2291.

The fiscal note on the original vote indicates no fiscal impact on the state.
