SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON SENATE BILL NO. 41

As Amended by House Committee on
Education

Brief*

SB 41, as amended, would amend state law dealing with school district consolidation and disorganization. In situations where a school district disorganizes and the territory of the disorganized district is attached to more than one district, the state financial aid of the disorganized district is allocated to the districts to which the territory of the former district is attached. The state financial aid would be allocated on the same proportional basis that the assessed valuation of the territory attached to each district bears to the assessed valuation of the entire disorganized district.

SB 41, as amended, would repeal KSA 72-67,106; 72-8149; 72-8155; 72-8155a; 72-8155b; and 72-8155c which authorized several school district transfers and fund transfers between 1965 and 1980.

Background

Senator Vratil spoke in support of the original bill. There were no opponents of the original bill.

The House Committee on Education amended the bill by adding the provision dealing with situations where a school district disorganizes and the territory of the disorganized district is attached to more than one district, the state financial aid of the disorganized district is allocated to the districts to which the territory of the former district is attached. The state financial aid

would be allocated on the same proportional basis that the assessed valuation of the territory attached to each district bears to the assessed valuation of the entire disorganized district.

According to the Division of Budget fiscal note on the original bill, there would be no fiscal impact.
