**SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON
SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 2099**

As Recommended by Senate Committee on
Federal and State Affairs

Brief*

Senate Sub. for HB 2099 would amend the Kansas Open Records Act (KORA) to add to an existing exception the provision that a public agency would not be required to disclose the name, address, or other contact information of an alleged victim of stalking, domestic violence, or sexual assault

Background

The Senate Committee deleted the provisions of HB 2099 and inserted an amended provision of SB 87 into the bill. The provisions of HB 2099 were inserted into HB 2233 which was enacted into law. The provision in SB 87 that was amended and inserted into HB 2099 was the word "stalking" in place of the word "crime." SB 87 was enacted into law previously in the 2009 Session.
