**SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON SENATE
SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 2226**

As Recommended by Senate Committee on
Judiciary

Brief*

Senate Sub. for HB 2226 would increase the fine assessed on traffic infractions that are on the uniform fine schedule by \$15. The revenue created by the increased fine would be directed to the State Treasury for distribution as follows:

- 10.94 percent to the Crime Victims Compensation Fund;
- 2.24 percent to the Crime Victims Assistance Fund;
- 2.75 percent to the Community Alcoholism and Intoxication Programs Fund;
- 7.65 percent to the Department of Corrections Alcohol and Drug Abuse Treatment Fund;
- 0.16 percent to the Boating Fee Fund;
- 0.11 percent to the Children's Advocacy Center Fund;
- 2.28 percent to the EMS Revolving Fund;
- 2.28 percent to the Trauma Fund;
- 2.28 percent to the Traffic Records Enhancement Fund;

- 2.91 percent to the criminal justice information system line fund; and
- The remainder to the State General Fund.

Background

HB 2226, as introduced, would have provided for a third method to summon a grand jury. The Senate Committee deleted the grand jury provisions of the bill and inserted modified provisions of Sub. for HB 2413, which increases fines, penalties, and forfeitures. The provisions regarding the Kansas Criminal Justice Information System (KCJIS) were not part of Sub. for HB 2413.

The proponents of Sub. for HB 2413 who presented testimony in the Senate Committee hearing were representatives of the Kansas Association of Chiefs of Police, the Kansas Sheriffs Association, the Kansas Peace Officers Association, and the Kansas Sentencing Commission.

There were no opponents of the bill who presented testimony in the Senate Committee hearing.

The fiscal note provided on this bill, as introduced, is no longer applicable because the bill is a substitute bill.
