SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2414

As Amended by Senate Committee on Ways and Means

Brief*

HB 2414 would authorize the State Board of Regents, on behalf of Fort Hays State University, to sell and convey to the City of Hays, all of the rights, title, and interest, except mineral rights, in two tracts of real estate. One tract contains 120.0 acres. The second tract contains 10.037 acres. The tracts would be used for a sports complex and expansion of the City's golf course. The bill would take effect upon publication in the *Kansas Register*.

Background

The bill was part of the State Board of Regents' legislative package and was introduced by the Legislative Educational Planning Committee. The proponents of the bill were the City Manager of the City of Hays and the President of Fort Hays State University.

There were no opponents of the bill.

The Senate Committee on Ways and Means amended the bill to allow it to take effect upon publication in the *Kansas Register*, instead of upon publication in the statute book.

The fiscal note prepared by the Division of the Budget projected revenues from the property conveyance to be \$320,574, which would be credited to the Restricted Fees Fund of Fort Hays State University for the University's benefit, specifically for use by the University Farm for possible future purchases of land, equipment, or other farming needs.
