SESSION OF 2010

SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2572

As Recommended by House Committee on Government Efficiency and Fiscal Oversight

Brief*

HB 2572 would require the Chief Information Technology Architect (CITA) to conduct a study evaluating the feasibility of information technology consolidation opportunities for state agencies. On or before August 1, 2010, the CITA would submit a feasibility study to the Council of Chief Information Technology Officers. If the study findings were approved, then the Council would develop recommendations for strategic initiatives, conduct a cost-benefit analysis, and formulate implementation processes for a consolidation plan.

The bill would require that on or before September 1, 2010, the Council would submit any recommended consolidated plan to the Information Technology Executive Council. If the Council approved a plan, then the Chief Information Technology Officers would be authorized to implement the plan.

Background

The Director of the Division of Information Systems and Communications spoke in favor of the bill. There were no opponents.

According to the fiscal note, HB 2572 could be implemented with current staffing and funding levels of the Division of Information Systems and Communications.
