OPPONENT WRITTEN ONLY TESTIMONY HB 2641

Wednesday, February 14, 2024 House Education Committee Kansas State Board of Education, Liaisons, Ann Mah and Deena Horst

Chairman Thomas and Committee members:

Thank you for allowing us to testify on behalf of the Kansas State Board of Education (KSBE) in opposition to HB 2641. HB 2641 proposes to provide prescriptive guidance to local boards of education regarding how privately owned electronic communication devices shall be used at schools.

While the KSBE has no formal position on the use of such devices in schools, it does have a very strong position in support of local boards of education and their authority to make such policy decisions. Some local boards have already put such policies in place, and we believe the Legislature has no authority to override those policies. The use of electronic communication devices in schools is something that is not a "one-size-fits-all" issue and does not have a "one-size-fits-all" answer. Such things are best left to those closest to the issue.

We appreciate your time and hope the Committee will oppose HB 2641.
