1 2 3 4	AN ACT concerning health and healthcare; relating to pharmacy; authorizing pharmacy technicians to administer certain vaccines; amending K.S.A. 65-1635a and repealing the existing section.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:
6	Section 1. K.S.A. 65-1635a is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-
7	1635a. (a) A pharmacist, or a pharmacy student-or, intern or pharmacy
8	technician who is working under the direct supervision and control of a
9	pharmacist, may administer influenza vaccine to a person six years of age
10	or older and may administer vaccine, other than influenza vaccine, to a
11	person 12 years of age or older pursuant to a vaccination protocol if the
12	pharmacist, pharmacy student-or, intern or pharmacy technician has
13	successfully completed a course of study and training, approved by the
14	accreditation council for pharmacy or the board, in vaccination storage,
15	protocols, injection technique, emergency procedures and recordkeeping
16	and has taken a course in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and has a
17	current CPR certificate when administering vaccine. A pharmacist-or,
18	pharmacy student-or, intern or pharmacy technician who successfully
19	completes such a course of study and training shall maintain proof of
20	completion and, upon request, provide a copy of such proof to the board.
21	(b) All vaccinees will be given a written immunization record for
22	their personal files. The administering pharmacist or pharmacist
23	supervising an administering pharmacy student-or, intern or pharmacy
24	technician shall promptly report a record of the immunization to the
25	vaccinee's primary care provider by mail, electronic facsimile, e-mail
26	email or other electronic means. If the vaccinee does not have a primary
27	care provider, then the administering pharmacist or pharmacist supervising
28	an administering pharmacy student-or, intern or pharmacy technician shall
29	promptly report a record of the immunization to the person licensed to
30	practice medicine and surgery by the state board of healing arts who has
31	entered into the vaccination protocol with the pharmacist. The
32 33	immunization will also be reported to appropriate county or state
33 34	immunization registries, except that if the person vaccinated or, if the person is a minor, the parent or guardian of the minor, objects to the report,
34 35	the report shall not be made.
