Chairman Ellis and Committee members on Veterans and Military Affairs:

Thank you for taking the time to consider my opposition for HB2211.

Ronald Reagan once said, "Government is not a solution to our problem, government is the problem.." This HB2211 is just that: it is a problem and threat to the security of the liberty of the people of Kansas. It is a questionable proposal that someone would suggest giving so much concentrated power in the hands of one person—the Governor.

I strongly urge you to oppose this bill and let our law enforcement keep the actual threats from its citizens, not Homeland Security deter those who oppose their elected officials' decisions.
