Subject: House Bill 2723: Making appropriations for the department for aging and disability services for FY 2025 and creating a program for cities to improve and develop infrastructure for homeless shelters.

House Bill 2723 proposes an item of appropriation and a new section of law concerning the appropriation. Section 1 appropriates \$40 million dollars from the state general fund to the Kansas department of aging and disability services to “administer a program intended to address homeless shelter infrastructure pursuant to section 2, and amendments thereto.”

Section 2 establishes a grant program to award funds to Kansas local governments for the building of or capital improvements to congregate and non-congregate shelters that provide services for homeless individuals and families and persons at risk of homelessness. The program shall be for the fiscal year 2025. The department shall award grants to local governments who:

- (1) Propose a building plan or improvement plan for a congregate or non-congregate shelter that provides services for homeless individuals and families and persons at risk of homelessness;
- (2) provide wraparound housing services to homeless individuals and families and persons at risk of homelessness;
- (3) collect data required by the department of housing and urban development;
- (4) prioritize long-term wraparound services for persons who are Kansas residents or have proof of presence within Kansas for eight consecutive months;
- (5) provide long-term wraparound services prioritized for Kansas residents; and
- (6) enforce local ordinances regarding camping and vagrancy.

Funding awarded shall be matched by the local government on a \$1-for-\$1 basis. If the local government misuses or fails to use funds or fails to enforce local ordinances or provide required services, then the local government shall pay the department for aging and disability services the amount originally awarded, or the department may file for a lien on the real property constructed for the amount originally awarded. Section 2 establishes a fund in the state treasury for the program and appropriation in section 1.

Proposed technical amendment attached. The amendment strikes items not intended to be included in HB 2723.

10 (a) There is appropriated for the above agency from the state general
11 fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025, the following:

12 Homeless shelter infrastructure grant.....\$40,000,000
13 *Provided*, That expenditures shall be made from the homeless shelter

14 infrastructure grant account in an amount not to exceed \$40,000,000 to
15 administer a program intended to address homeless shelter
16 infrastructure pursuant to section 2, and amendments thereto.

17 Sec. 2. (a) Subject to appropriations, the secretary for aging and
18 disability services shall develop and administer a grant program to award
19 funds to Kansas local governments to be allocated for the building of or
20 capital improvements to congregate and non-congregate shelters that

13 (2) the secretary for aging and disability services may file for a lien to

16 (e) There is hereby established in the state treasury the homeless
17 shelter infrastructure grant fund, and such fund shall be administered by
18 the secretary for aging and disability services. All expenditures from the
19 homeless shelter infrastructure grant fund shall be for grants awarded
20 according to this section. All expenditures from the homeless shelter
21 infrastructure grant fund shall be made in accordance with appropriation
22 acts upon warrants approved by the director of accounts and reports pursuant
23 to vouchers approved by the secretary for aging and disability services or
24 the secretary's designee. All moneys received pursuant to subsection (d)
25 shall be remitted to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of
26 K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of each such
27 remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state
28 treasury to the credit of the homeless shelter infrastructure grant fund.

29 Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its
30 publication in the statute book.
