I am supportive of the inclusion of \$40M in the Kansas Department for Aging & Disability Services (KDADS) budget to provide matching grants to communities to assist in addressing housing infrastructure needs. The availability of suitable housing plays a pivotal role in the overall health and independence of seniors and individuals with disabilities. Unfortunately, many individuals face significant challenges in accessing affordable, accessible, and safe housing options that cater to their unique needs. By allocating \$40M to the KDADS budget specifically for housing infrastructure, we can take a significant step towards addressing this pressing issue.

Investing in housing infrastructure not only supports the well-being of seniors and individuals with disabilities but also has broader positive effects on the community.
