We work to solve issues no single donor, charity or government agency can handle alone. We work with residents, and public and private partners to co-create solutions that ensure everyone has the resources, support, opportunities, and networks they need to thrive. We commit to leveraging all our assets to create more equitable communities. Over the past decade, UWKV has invested in the areas of Early Education, On-Grade Achievement, Financial Stability, Health, Substance Abuse, and Basic Needs.

Each year, we serve thousands of individuals and families in Shawnee, Douglas, Jackson, and Jefferson counties who struggle to make ends meet.
