Chair Baumgardner and Members of the Committee, thank you for the opportunity to provide opponent written testimony on House Bill 2238.

I am parent, grandparent and retired teacher opposed to HB2238. This bill is not necessary but it would further isolate a few children who are different, and prevent them, if they choose, to fully participate in the benefits of sports at school.
