SB 50

Esteemed Senators,

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on behalf of SB 50, The Social Media Anti-Censorship Bill. For the sake of brevity, the following points are of particular note:

- Section 230 of the Federal Code was passed in 1996 to provide legal immunity to fledgling social media companies (interactive computer services). It also gave these companies authority to moderate problematic content.
- 2) These fledgling companies with their legal immunity grew into mega companies know as Facebook, Twitter, YouTube, etc..

- 6) SB 50 artfully navigates Section 230. SB 50 protects the social media's First Amendment rights. And, it protects the Kansas citizen's rights to be heard regardless of political affiliation via our consumer protection act.

Bottom line- While the social media cancel culture has been historically focused on conservative thought, I truly believe that this is a bipartisan bill worthy of all our support. The censorship gun may be pointed at me now but the barrel can swing to a new target very quickly. Just ask Elon Musk.
