The fact that HB2086 includes changes to sixty-six sections of statutes is genuinely concerning. I feel some of these changes to HB2086 should be stand-alone bills. For easy consumption to the public, and discussion in the Kansas Senate, fifty-three pages for a bill is too long! Let us not accept and approve these major election process changes by cramming it all into one huge bill.

This bill provides the Secretary of State with additional powers with respect to election and those processes. There is no method of holding the SOS accountable with this new centralized power. Kansas residents are asking for accountability. In fact, America is asking for accountability nationwide. And why is this bill asking to remove power from the precinct committee position? Why should the State or County Party Chair to object to a precinct person? Objections should only be based on residency, voter qualification, and party affiliation, and statute is already providing for that. So why a need for objection? The statue regarding the use of ballots has been modified/written by the currents SOS's office to agree with the Rules and Regulations, to allow for the use of ballot images. What are the security measures for the computer containing the ballot image? This is concerning for anyone following all the ongoing mess happening in Arizona and other places. Security. Checks and Balances. Transparency. That is what your Kansas constituents want! AND, do not mess with the 3-foot rule for poll agents! Extending that distance would be detrimental to observation process.
