(a) There is appropriated for the above agency from the state general fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025, the following:

- Sec. 2. (a) Subject to appropriations, the secretary for aging and disability services shall develop and administer a grant program to award funds to Kansas local governments to be allocated for the building of or capital improvements to congregate and non-congregate shelters that provide services for homeless individuals and families and persons at risk of homelessness.
- (b) For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025, the secretary for aging and disability services shall award grants to Kansas local governments that:
- (1) Propose a building plan or improvement plan for a congregate or non-congregate shelter that provides services for homeless individuals and families and persons at risk of homelessness;
- (2) provide wraparound housing services to homeless individuals and families and persons at risk of homelessness;
- (3) collect data required by the department of housing and urban development;
- (4) prioritize long-term wraparound services for persons who are Kansas residents or have proof of presence within Kansas for eight

The secretary shall award 20% of the total amount appropriated for such grant program to municipalities with a population of less than 45,000
