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AN ACT concerning wildlife and parks; relating to hunting and fishing 1 2 licenses: exempting disabled veterans from certain requirements: amending K.S.A. 32-906, 32-919 and 32-988 and repealing the existing 3 4 sections. 5 6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 7 New Section 1. (a) Subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 32-920, and amendments thereto, the secretary of wildlife and parks or the 8 secretary's designee shall issue, free of charge, a permanent license to 9 hunt and fish to any person residing in the state who submits to the 10 11 secretary satisfactory proof that the person is a disabled veteran. Any 12 such person hunting or fishing in this state shall be subject to the 13 provisions of all rules and regulations relating to hunting or fishing. 14 (b) As used in this section, "disabled veteran" means a person 15 who: Was a member of the armed services; 16 (1) (2) has separated from the armed services under honorable 17 conditions: and 18 19 (3) has a disability certified by the Kansas commission on 20 veterans affairs office as being service-connected and such service-21 connected disability is equal or greater than 30%. 22 Section 1. Sec. 2. K.S.A. 32-906 is hereby amended to read as 23 follows: 32-906. (a) Except as otherwise provided by law or rules and 24 regulations of the secretary of wildlife and parks, a valid Kansas fishing 25 license is required to fish or to take any bullfrog in this state. 26 The provisions of subsection (a) do not apply to fishing by: (b) 27 A person, or a member of a person's immediate family domiciled (1)28 with such person, on land owned by such person or on land leased or 29 rented by such person for agricultural purposes; 30 (2) a person who is less than 16 years of age; 31 (3) a resident of this state who is 75 years of age or more; (4)—a resident of this state who is 75 years of age or older; 32 (4) a person fishing in a private water fishing impoundment unless 33 waived pursuant to K.S.A. 32-975, and amendments thereto; 34 (5)(4)(5) a resident of an adult care home, as defined by K.S.A. 39-35 36 923, and amendments thereto, licensed by the secretary-of for aging and

1 *disability services*;

(6)(5)(6) a person on dates designated pursuant to subsection (f);

3 (7)(6)(7) a person fishing under a valid institutional group fishing
 4 license issued pursuant to subsection (g); or or

(8)(7)(8) a participant in a fishing clinic sponsored or cosponsored by
 the department, during the period of time that the fishing clinic is being
 conducted; or

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(8) a disabled veteran who lives in Kansas.

9 (c) The fee for a fishing license shall be the amount prescribed 10 pursuant to K.S.A. 32-988, and amendments thereto.

11 (d) Unless otherwise provided by law or rules and regulations of the 12 secretary, a fishing license is valid throughout the state.

(e) Unless otherwise provided by law or rules and regulations of the
 secretary, a fishing license is valid from the date of issuance and expires
 on December 31 following its issuance, except that the secretary may issue
 a:

17 (1) Permanent license pursuant to K.S.A. 32-929, and amendments18 thereto;

19 (2) lifetime license pursuant to K.S.A. 32-930, and amendments 20 thereto;

(3) nonresident fishing license valid for a period of five days; and

(4) resident or nonresident fishing license valid for a period of 24hours.

(f) The secretary may designate by resolution two days each calendar
year during which persons may fish by legal means without having a valid
fishing license.

(g) (1) The secretary shall issue an annual institutional group fishing license to each facility operating under the jurisdiction of or licensed by the secretary for aging and disability services and to any veterans administration medical center in the state of Kansas upon application by such facility or center to the secretary of wildlife; *and* parks-and tourism for such license.

33 (2) All applications for facilities under the jurisdiction of the secretary for aging and disability services shall be made with the approval 34 35 of the secretary for aging and disability services and shall provide such information as the secretary of wildlife; and parks-and tourism requires. 36 37 All applications for any veterans administration medical center shall be 38 made with the approval of the director of such facility and shall provide 39 such information as the secretary of wildlife, and parks-and tourismrequires. Persons who have been admitted to and are currently residing at 40 the facility or center, not to exceed 20 at any one time, may fish under an 41 institutional group fishing license within the state while on a group trip, 42 43 group outing or other group activity which is supervised by the facility or

center. Persons fishing under an institutional group fishing license shall not
 be required to obtain a fishing license but shall be subject to all other laws
 and to all rules and regulations relating to fishing.

4 (3) The staff personnel of the facility or center supervising the group 5 trip, group outing or other group activity shall have in their possession the 6 institutional license when engaged in supervising any activity requiring the 7 license. Such staff personnel may assist group members in all aspects of 8 their fishing activity.

9 (h) (1) The secretary may issue a special nonprofit group fishing license to any community, civic or charitable organization which is 10 organized as a not-for-profit corporation, for use by such community, civic 11 or charitable organization for the sole purpose of conducting group fishing 12 activities for handicapped or developmentally disabled individuals. All 13 applications for a special nonprofit group fishing license shall be made to 14 the secretary or the secretary's designee and shall provide such information 15 16 as required by the secretary.

(2) Handicapped or developmentally disabled individualsPersons 17 with a physical or developmental disability, not to exceed 20 at any one 18 19 time, may fish under a special nonprofit group fishing license while on a group trip, outing or activity which is supervised by the community, civic 20 21 or charitable organization. Individuals fishing under a special nonprofit 22 group fishing license shall not be required to obtain a fishing license but 23 shall be subject to all other laws and rules and regulations relating to 24 fishing.

(3) The staff personnel of the community, civic or charitable organization supervising the group trip, outing or activity shall have in their possession the special nonprofit group fishing license when engaged in supervising any activity requiring the special nonprofit group fishing license. Such staff personnel may assist group members in all aspects of their fishing activity.

18 (6) a disabled veteran who resides in Kansas and hunts only smallgame as defined in K.S.A. 32-701, and amendments thereto.

20 (c) The fee for a hunting license shall be the amount prescribed 21 pursuant to K.S.A. 32-988, and amendments thereto.

22 (d) Unless otherwise provided by law or rules and regulations of the 23 secretary, a hunting license is valid throughout the state, except that the secretary may issue a special controlled shooting area license-which that is 24 25 valid only for licensed controlled shooting areas.

26 (e) Unless otherwise provided by law or rules and regulations of the 27 secretary, a hunting license is valid from the date of issuance and expires 28 on December 31 following its issuance, except that:

29 (1) The secretary may issue a permanent license pursuant to K.S.A. 30 32-929, and amendments thereto; and

31 (2) the secretary may issue a lifetime license pursuant to K.S.A. 32-32 930, and amendments thereto.

33 (f) A 48-hour waterfowl permit may be issued which authorizes hunting of waterfowl in this state subject to all other provisions of law and 34 35 rules and regulations of the secretary. The fee for such permit shall be the amount prescribed pursuant to K.S.A. 32-988, and amendments thereto. 36 37 Such permit is valid throughout the state, is valid from the time designated 38 on the permit and expires 48 hours after such time. Purchase of such 39 permit shall not affect the requirement to purchase any federal migratory 40 bird hunting and conservation stamp or state migratory waterfowl habitat 41 stamp.

10	(b) The fee for a landowner-tenant resident big game or wild turkey
11	hunting permit shall be an amount equal to $1/2$ the fee for a general resident
12	big game or wild turkey hunting permit.
13	(c) The fee for a big game or wild turkey hunting permit for a resident
14	under 16 years of age shall be an amount not to exceed $1/2$ the fee for a
15	general resident big game or wild turkey hunting permit.
16	(d) The fee for a furharvester license for a resident under 16 years of
17	age shall be an amount equal to $1/2$ the fee for a resident furharvester
18	license.
19	(e) For a resident who is at least 65 years of age, but less than 75
20	years of age:
21	(1) The fee for an annual hunting license shall be an amount equal to
22	⁺ / ₂ the fee for a general annual hunting license;
23	(2) the fee for an annual fishing license shall be an amount equal to $\frac{1}{2}$
24	the fee for a general annual fishing license; and
25	(3) the fee for an annual combination hunting and fishing license-
26	shall be an amount equal to $\frac{1}{2}$ the fee for a general annual combination
27	hunting and fishing license.
28	(f) —For a resident who is at least 65 years of age but less than 75
29	years of age:
30	(1) The fee for an annual hunting license shall be an amount
31	equal to $1/_2$ the fee for a general annual hunting license;
32	(2) the fee for an annual fishing license shall be an amount equal
33	to ¹ / ₂ the fee for a general annual fishing license; and
34	(3) the fee for an annual combination hunting and fishing license
35	shall be an amount equal to $1/2$ the fee for a general annual
36	combination hunting and fishing license.
37	(f) Any person who is a resident of this state and satisfies the
38	requirements to be considered a disabled veteran under K.S.A. 32-906 and
39	32-919 section 1, and amendments thereto, shall be exempt from the
40	hunting and fishing license fees listed in subsection (a).
41	(f)(g) The secretary may establish, by rules and regulations adopted in
42	accordance with K.S.A. 32-805, and amendments thereto, different fees for
43	various classes and types of licenses, permits, stamps and other issuances

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- 1 of the department which may occur within each item as described under 2 subsection (a).
- 3 (g) The provisions of subsection (e) shall expire on June 30, 2020.
