AN ACT concerning public assistance; relating to energy assistance and housing assistance; requiring the secretary for children and families to develop a low income energy assistance program and the secretary for aging and disability services to develop a program for unhoused individuals to find and secure affordable housing; determining eligibility for such programs.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) The secretary for children and families shall develop and implement a program to expend federal moneys allocated for the purpose of assisting eligible households to pay home energy costs with a one-time per year benefit.

- (b) Annually, the secretary shall accept applications for such benefit, determine eligible households and administer the benefits to such households.
- (c) To receive benefits administered by the secretary pursuant to this section, an eligible household shall:
- (1) Have one adult living at the address that is personally responsible for paying the heating costs incurred at the current residence, payable to either the landlord or utility;
- (2) demonstrate a recent history of payments toward the purchase of the primary heating energy; and
- (3) have a combined gross income less than or equal to 150% of the federal poverty level.
- (d) If such eligible household has an able-bodied adult aged 18 through 49 without dependents and is not employed at least 30 hours per week, such adult shall be enrolled in an employment or training program administered by the Kansas department for children and families to remain eligible for such benefit.
- (e) For the purposes of this section, "household" means the applicant or recipient for all individuals living together, among whom there is a relationship of legal responsibility or a qualifying caretaker relationship. This includes a cohabiting significant other living with the person legally responsible for a child.
- New Sec. 2. (a) The secretary for aging and disability services shall develop and implement a program to expend all federal moneys allocated

for the purpose of assisting individuals who are unhoused or at risk of being unhoused find and secure affordable housing.

- (b) Annually, the secretary shall accept applications for such benefit, determine eligible households and administer the benefits to such households.
- (c) To receive benefits administered by the secretary pursuant to this section, an eligible household shall:
- (1) Have one adult living at the address that is personally responsible for paying the housing costs; and
- (2) have a combined gross income less than or equal to 50% of the median income for the county or metropolitan area where the household chooses to live.
- (d) If such eligible household has an able-bodied adult aged 18 through 49 without dependents and is not employed at least 30 hours per week, such adult shall be enrolled in an employment or training program administered by the Kansas department for children and families to remain eligible for such benefit.
- (e) Recipients receiving similar moneys allocated for the purpose of assisting individuals who are unhoused or at risk of being unhoused find and secure affordable housing from a municipality or local housing authority shall also be subject to the eligibility requirements in subsection (c) and (d).
- (f) For the purposes of this section, "household" means the applicant or recipient for all individuals living together, among whom there is a relationship of legal responsibility or a qualifying caretaker relationship. This includes a cohabiting significant other living with the person legally responsible for a child.
- Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
