AN ACT concerning higher education; relating to state scholarships; 1 2 increasing the dollar amount of state scholarships for students who 3 have established financial need; amending K.S.A. 74-32,233 and 74-4 32,235 and repealing the existing sections. 5 6 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:* 7 Section 1. K.S.A. 74-32,233 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8 74-32,233. As used in-this act K.S.A. 74-32,233 through 74-32,239, and 9 amendments thereto: 10 (a) "State scholarship" means an award under this act K.S.A. 74-11 32,233 through 74-32,239, and amendments thereto, by this the state to a 12 state scholar who has established financial need. 13 (b) "State scholar" means a full-time, in-state student who has exhibited scholastic ability and who is initially acceptable for entering an 14 eligible institution or who has so entered and is in good standing and 15 making satisfactory progress. 16 (c) "Full-time, in-state student" means a person who is a resident of 17 18 Kansas and who is enrolled at an eligible institution in an educational 19 program for at least 12 hours each semester or the equivalent thereof, or 20 who is regularly enrolled at an eligible institution in a vocational or 21 technical education program. The board of regents shall determine the 22 number of hours for terms or program periods other than semesters to 23 constitute the equivalent of 12 hours. 24 (d) "Financial need" means the difference between the available-25 financial resources of a student and such student's total anticipated-26 expenses to attend an eligible institution. A student's financial resources-27 shall include (1) four hundred and fifty dollars each year from the student's 28 own work and resources, and (2) a contribution from the income and assets of the student's parents, if sufficient, as determined by a completed-29 30 financial needs analysis statement and based upon the accepted criteria of 31 a nationally recognized financial needs analysis agency. Financial need 32 shall be redetermined annually a student's available financial resources 33 and such student's total anticipated annual attendance cost at an eligible 34 institution. A student's financial resources shall be determined based on criteria provided under the federal methodology of need analysis. 35 (e) "Eligible institution" means an institution of a postsecondary 36

2 and amendments thereto, or a not - for - profit independent institution of

3 higher education that is accredited by the north central association of 4 colleges and secondary schools accrediting agency based on its -

- 5 requirements as of April 1, 1985, or by the higher learning commission of
- 6 the north central association of colleges and schools based on its-

7 requirements as of January 1, 2006, is operated independently and not-

8 controlled or administered by the state or any agency or subdivision-

9 *thereof*, maintains open enrollment, *and* the main campus or principal-10 place of operation of which is located in Kansas, and which qualifies as an

11 eligible institution for the federal guaranteed-loan program under the-

higher education act of 1965 (P.L. 89-329), as amended postsecondary education with its main campus or principal place of operation in Kansas, is operated independently and not controlled or administered by any state agency or subdivision of the state, maintains open enrollment and is accredited by a nationally recognized accrediting agency for higher education in the United States.

(f) "Open enrollment" means the policy of an *eligible* institution-of postsecondary education which provides the opportunity of enrollment for any student who meets its academic and other reasonable enrollment requirements, without regard for race, gender, religion, creed or national origin.

(g) "Board of regents" means the state board of regents provided for
 in the constitution of this state and described in article 32 of chapter 74 of
 Kansas Statutes Annotated, *and amendments thereto*.

(h) "Term" means one of two or more divisions of an academic year
of an *eligible* institution-of postsecondary education in which substantially
all courses begin and end at substantially the same time and during which
instruction is regularly given to students.

(i) "Semester" means one of two principal terms, when there are only
 two principal terms in the academic year, whether or not there are other
 shorter terms during the same academic year.

(j) "Program period" means the duration of the period of time, or any
 division thereof, required for completion of a vocational or technical
 education program which is given in an *eligible* institution—of—
 postsecondary education.

(k) "State educational institution" means the same as defined in
K.S.A. 76-711, and amendments thereto.

(1) "Annual attendance cost" means the average cost of in-state
tuition and required fees for 30 credit hours of undergraduate instruction
across each state educational institution and Washburn university of
Topeka.

43 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 74-32,235 is hereby amended to read as follows: 74-

32,235. (a) The amount of a state scholarship awarded to a state scholar for 1

the fall and spring semesters, or the equivalent thereof, shall be the amount 2 of the state scholar's financial need for the period, except that state 3 4 scholarships awarded to a state scholar in any year shall not exceed:

5 (1) Five hundred dollars in any year if the state scholar initially is or 6 was awarded a state scholarship for any program period, term or semester 7 commencing prior to July 1, 1985; and

8 (2) one thousand dollars in any year if the state scholar initially is 9 awarded a state scholarship for any program period, term or semestercommencing after July 1, 1985 the lesser of the actual cost of attendance 10 in any year or 70% of the annual attendance cost if the state scholar is 11 12 awarded a state scholarship for any program period, term or semester 13 commencing after July 1, 2023.

14 (b) When state scholarships are awarded to a state scholar for any 15 program period or for one or more terms that are not semesters, the board 16 of regents shall determine the equivalent of the fall and spring semesters. 17

K.S.A. 74-32,233 and 74-32,235 are hereby repealed. Sec. 3.

18 Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 19 publication in the statute book.
