1 AN ACT concerning the lottery operating fund; increasing transfers to the
2 community crisis stabilization centers fund and the clubhouse model
3 program fund of the Kansas department for aging and disability
4 services; amending K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 74-8711 and repealing the
5 existing section.

7 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

8 Section 1. K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 74-8711 is hereby amended to read as
9 follows: 74-8711. (a) There is hereby established in the state treasury the
10 lottery operating fund.

11 (b) Except as provided by K.S.A. 74-8724 and the Kansas expanded
12 lottery act, and amendments thereto, the executive director shall remit all
13 moneys collected from the sale of lottery tickets and shares and any other
14 moneys received by or on behalf of the Kansas lottery to the state treasurer
15 in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments
16 thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall
17 deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the lottery
18 operating fund. Moneys credited to the fund shall be expended or
19 transferred only as provided by this act. Expenditures from such fund shall
20 be made in accordance with appropriations acts upon warrants of the
21 director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by
22 the executive director or by a person designated by the executive director.

23 (c) Moneys in the lottery operating fund shall be used for:

24 (1) The payment of expenses of the lottery, which shall include all
25 costs incurred in the operation and administration of the Kansas lottery; all
26 costs resulting from contracts entered into for the purchase or lease of
27 goods and services needed for operation of the lottery, including but not
28 limited to supplies, materials, tickets, independent studies and surveys,
29 data transmission, advertising, printing, promotion, incentives, public
30 relations, communications and distribution of tickets and shares; and
31 reimbursement of costs of facilities and services provided by other state
32 agencies;

33 (2) the payment of compensation to lottery retailers;

34 (3) transfers of moneys to the lottery prize payment fund pursuant to
35 K.S.A. 74-8712, and amendments thereto;

1 (4) transfers to the state general fund pursuant to K.S.A. 74-8713, and
2 amendments thereto;

3 (5) transfers to the community crisis stabilization centers fund and
4 clubhouse model program fund of the Kansas department for aging and
5 disability services pursuant to subsection (e);

6 (6) transfers to the state gaming revenues fund pursuant to subsection
7 (d) and as otherwise provided by law;

8 (7) transfers to the white collar crime fund of the governor pursuant
9 to subsection (f);

10 (8) transfers to the problem gambling and addictions grant fund of the
11 department for aging and disability services pursuant to subsection (g);

12 (9) transfers to the attracting professional sports to Kansas fund of the
13 department of commerce pursuant to subsection (h); and

14 (10) transfers to the county reappraisal fund as prescribed by law.

15 (d) The director of accounts and reports shall transfer moneys in the
16 lottery operating fund to the state gaming revenues fund created by K.S.A.
17 79-4801, and amendments thereto, on or before the 15th day of each month
18 in an amount certified monthly by the executive director and determined as
19 follows, whichever is greater:

20 (1) An amount equal to the moneys in the lottery operating fund in
21 excess of those needed for the purposes described in subsections (c)(1)
22 through (c)(6); or

23 (2) except for pull-tab lottery tickets and shares, an amount equal to
24 not less than 30% of total monthly revenues from the sales of lottery
25 tickets and shares less estimated returned tickets. In the case of pull-tab
26 lottery tickets and shares, an amount equal to not less than 20% of the total
27 monthly revenues from the sales of pull-tab lottery tickets and shares less
28 estimated returned tickets.

29 (e) (1) Subject to the limitations set forth in paragraph (2),
30 ~~commencing in fiscal year 2020~~, on or before the 10th day of each month,
31 the director of the lottery shall certify to the director of accounts and
32 reports all net profits from the sale of lottery tickets and shares via lottery
33 ticket vending machines. Of such certified amount, the director of
34 accounts and reports shall transfer 75% from the lottery operating fund to
35 the community crisis stabilization centers fund of the Kansas department
36 for aging and disability services and 25% from the lottery operating fund
37 to the clubhouse model program fund of the Kansas department for aging
38 and disability services.

39 (2) Moneys transferred pursuant to paragraph (1) shall not exceed in
40 the aggregate ~~\$9,000,000 in fiscal years 2023 and 2024, and shall not~~
41 ~~exceed in the aggregate \$8,000,000~~ ~~\$12,000,000~~ **\$8,000,000** in fiscal year
42 ~~2025~~ **2027** and each fiscal year thereafter.

43 (3) **During fiscal years 2025 and 2026, on or before the 15th day of**

1 **each month, the director of accounts and reports shall transfer**
2 **\$750,000 from the lottery operating fund to the community crisis**
3 **stabilization centers fund of the Kansas department for aging and**
4 **disability services and \$250,000 from the lottery operating fund to the**
5 **clubhouse model program fund of the Kansas department for aging**
6 **and disability services.**

7 (f) On July 1, 2023, and each July 1 thereafter, or as soon thereafter
8 as moneys are available, the first \$750,000 credited to the lottery operating
9 fund from sports wagering revenues deposited in the lottery operating fund
10 shall be transferred by the director of accounts and reports from the lottery
11 operating fund to the white collar crime fund established in K.S.A. 2023
12 Supp. 74-8792, and amendments thereto.

13 (g) On July 1, 2023, and each July 1 thereafter, or as soon thereafter
14 as moneys are available, after the transfer required under subsection (f) has
15 been made, 2% of the remaining moneys credited to the lottery operating
16 fund from sports wagering revenues deposited in the lottery operating fund
17 shall be transferred by the director of accounts and reports from the lottery
18 operating fund to the problem gambling and addictions grant fund
19 established in K.S.A. 79-4805, and amendments thereto.

20 (h) On July 1, 2023, and each July 1 thereafter, or as soon thereafter
21 as moneys are available, after the transfer required under subsection (f) has
22 been made, 80% of the remaining moneys credited to the lottery operating
23 fund from sports wagering revenues deposited in the lottery operating fund
24 shall be transferred by the director of accounts and reports from the lottery
25 operating fund to the attracting professional sports to Kansas fund
26 established in K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 74-8793, and amendments thereto.

27 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 74-8711 is hereby repealed.

28 Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its
29 publication in the statute book.
