## HOUSE BILL No. 2671

1	AN ACT concerning wildlife and parks; relating to hunting licenses;
2	reducing nonresident hunting fees, including application, license, tag
3	and miscellaneous fees, to a combined amount not to exceed \$25 and
4	requiring such fee to be refundable for any nonresident who does not
5	acquire a hunting permit for the applicable hunting license year;
6	amending K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 32-988 and repealing the existing section.

8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:
9	Section 1. K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 32-988 is hereby amended to read as
10	follows: 32-988. (a) The secretary is authorized to adopt, in accordance
11	with K.S.A. 32-805, and amendments thereto, rules and regulations fixing
12	the amount of fees for the following items, subject to the following
13	limitations and subject to the requirement that no such rules and
14	regulations shall be adopted as temporary rules and regulations:
15	Big game permits
16	Resident (other than elk permit): maximum \$100
17	Nonresident (other than elk permit): maximum \$400
18	Elk permit: maximum \$350
19	Nonresident mule deer stamp: maximum \$150
20	Nonresident applications: maximum \$25

23	Lifetime: maximum \$1,000; or 8 quarterly payments, each

18 (b) The fee for a landowner-tenant resident big game or wild turkey 19 hunting permit shall be an amount equal to 1/2 the fee for a general resident 20 big game or wild turkey hunting permit.

21 (c) The fee for a big game or wild turkey hunting permit for a resident 22 under 16 years of age shall be an amount not to exceed  $\frac{1}{2}$  the fee for a 23 general resident big game or wild turkey hunting permit.

24 (d) The fee for a furharvester license for a resident under 16 years of 25 age shall be an amount equal to 1/2 the fee for a resident furharvester 26 license.

(e) For a resident who is at least 65 years of age, but less than 75years of age:

29 (1) The fee for an annual hunting license shall be an amount equal to  $\frac{1}{2}$  the fee for a general annual hunting license;

31 (2) the fee for an annual fishing license shall be an amount equal to  $1/_2$ 32 the fee for a general annual fishing license; and

33 (3) the fee for an annual combination hunting and fishing license 34 shall be an amount equal to  $\frac{1}{2}$  the fee for a general annual combination 35 hunting and fishing license.

(f) Any person who is a resident of this state and satisfies the
requirements to be considered a disabled veteran under K.S.A. 2023 Supp.
32-934, and amendments thereto, shall be exempt from the hunting and
fishing license fees listed in subsection (a).

(g) The secretary may establish, by rules and regulations adopted in
accordance with K.S.A. 32-805, and amendments thereto, different fees for
various classes and types of licenses, permits, stamps and other issuances
of the department-which *that* may occur within each item as described

2 (h) A nonresident who does not obtain a hunting permit for the

3 applicable hunting license year shall receive a complete refund of the

4 hunting license fee and any related fees that such nonresident paid

5 pursuant to subsection (a).
