1 AN ACT making and concerning appropriations for the fiscal years ending
2 June 30, 2024, June 30, 2025, and June 30, 2026, for state agencies;
3 authorizing certain transfers, capital improvement projects and fees,
4 imposing certain restrictions and limitations, and directing or
5 authorizing certain receipts, disbursements, procedures and acts
6 incidental to the foregoing; amending K.S.A. 2-223, 12-1775a and 12-
7 5256 and K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 65-180, 72-5462, 74-50,107, 74-99b34,
8 75-2263, 75-6707, 76-775, 76-7,107, 79-2959, 79-2964, 79-3425i, 79-
9 34,171 and 79-4804 and repealing the existing sections.

11 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

Section 1. (a) For the fiscal years ending June 30, 2024, June 30,
13 2025, and June 30, 2026, appropriations are hereby made, restrictions and
14 limitations are hereby imposed, and transfers, capital improvement
15 projects, fees, receipts, disbursements and acts incidental to the foregoing
16 are hereby directed or authorized as provided in this act.

17

(b) The agencies named in this act are hereby authorized to initiate
18 and complete the capital improvement projects specified and authorized by
19 this act or for which appropriations are made by this act, subject to the
20 restrictions and limitations imposed by this act.

21

(c) This act shall not be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 75-
22 6702(a), and amendments thereto.

(d) The appropriations made by this act shall not be subject to the
24 provisions of K.S.A. 46-155, and amendments thereto.

5 or other appropriation act of the 2023 regular session of the legislature are
6 hereby appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, for the state
7 agency for which the bond special revenue fund was established for the
8 purposes authorized by law for expenditures from such bond special
9 revenue fund. As used in this section, "bond special revenue fund" means
10 any special revenue fund or account thereof established in the state
11 treasury prior to or on or after the effective date of this act for the deposit
12 of the proceeds of bonds issued by the Kansas development finance
13 authority for the payment of debt service for bonds issued by the Kansas
14 development finance authority or for any related purpose in accordance
15 with applicable bond covenants.

16 Sec. 136. *Federal grants.* (a) During the fiscal year ending June 30,
17 2024, each federal grant or other federal receipt that is received by a state
18 agency named in this act and that is not otherwise appropriated to that state
19 agency for fiscal year 2023 by this or other appropriation act of the 2024
20 regular session of the legislature is hereby appropriated for fiscal year
21 2023 for that state agency for the purpose set forth in such federal grant or
22 receipt, except that no expenditure shall be made from and no obligation
23 shall be incurred against any such federal grant or other federal receipt that
24 has not been previously appropriated or reappropriated or approved for
25 expenditure by the governor until the governor has authorized the state
26 agency to make expenditures therefrom.

27 (b) In addition to the other purposes for which expenditures may be
28 made by any state agency that is named in this act and that is not otherwise
29 authorized by law to apply for and receive federal grants, expenditures
30 may be made by such state agency from moneys appropriated for fiscal
31 year 2024 by this act or any other appropriation act of the 2023 regular
32 session of the legislature to apply for and receive federal grants during
33 fiscal year 2024, which federal grants are hereby authorized to be applied
34 for and received by such state agencies: *Provided*, That no expenditure
35 shall be made from and no obligation shall be incurred against any such
36 federal grant or other federal receipt that has not been previously
37 appropriated or reappropriated or approved for expenditure by the
38 governor until the governor has authorized the state agency to make
39 expenditures therefrom.

40 Sec. 137. (a) Any correctional institutions building fund appropriation
41 heretofore appropriated to any state agency named in this or other
42 appropriation act of the 2023 regular session of the legislature and having
43 an unencumbered balance as of June 30, 2023, in excess of \$100 is hereby

1 reappropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, for the same uses
2 and purposes as originally appropriated, unless specific provision is made
3 for lapsing such appropriation.

4 (b) This subsection shall not apply to the unencumbered balance in
5 any account of the correctional institutions building fund that was
6 encumbered for any fiscal year commencing prior to July 1, 2022.

7 Sec. 138. (a) Any Kansas educational building fund appropriation
8 heretofore appropriated to any institution named in this or other
9 appropriation act of the 2023 regular session of the legislature and having
10 an unencumbered balance as of June 30, 2023, in excess of \$100 is hereby
11 reappropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, for the same use
12 and purpose as originally appropriated, unless specific provision is made
13 for lapsing such appropriation.

14 (b) This subsection shall not apply to the unencumbered balance in
15 any account of the Kansas educational building fund that was encumbered
16 for any fiscal year commencing prior to July 1, 2022.

17 Sec. 139. (a) Any state institutions building fund appropriation
18 heretofore appropriated to any state agency named in this or other
19 appropriation act of the 2023 regular session of the legislature and having
20 an unencumbered balance as of June 30, 2023, in excess of \$100 is hereby
21 reappropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, for the same use
22 and purpose as originally appropriated, unless specific provision is made
23 for lapsing such appropriation.

24 (b) This subsection shall not apply to the unencumbered balance in
25 any account of the state institutions building fund that was encumbered for
26 any fiscal year commencing prior to July 1, 2022.

27 Sec. 140. Any transfers of moneys during the fiscal year ending June
28 30, 2024, from any special revenue fund of any state agency named in this
29 act to the audit services fund of the division of post audit under K.S.A. 46-
30 1121, and amendments thereto, shall be in addition to any expenditure
31 limitation imposed on any such fund for the fiscal year ending June 30,
32 2024.
