1 AN ACT concerning the office of United States senator; relating to the 2 filling of a vacancy in such office; requiring appointment of a person of 3 the same political party as the incumbent; requiring senate confirmation 4 of such appointment; amending K.S.A. 25-318 and repealing the 5 existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

8 Section 1. K.S.A. 25-318 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-9 318. When a vacancy shall occur in the office of United States senator 10 from this state, the governor shall-make a temporary appointment to fill 11 such vacancy until the next election of representatives in congress, at-12 which time such vacancy shall be filled by election, and the senator so-13 elected shall take office as soon thereafter as he shall receive his certificate 14 of election appoint a suitable person who for the 10 years preceding such vacancy shall have been registered with the same political party as that of 15 16 the United States senator elected at the immediately preceding election for such office, to serve for the unexpired term and until a successor is elected 17 and qualified. If the United States senator elected at the immediately 18 19 preceding election for such office was not registered with any political 20 party, then the governor shall appoint a suitable person to serve for the 21 unexpired term and until a successor is elected and qualified. Appointments by the governor under this section shall be subject to 22 23 confirmation by the senate as provided in K.S.A. 75-4315b, and 24 amendments thereto. Except as provided by K.S.A. 46-2601, and 25 amendments thereto, no person appointed to the office of United States 26 senator shall exercise any power, duty or function as United States senator 27 until confirmed by the senate.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 25-318 is hereby repealed.
