RE: HB 2063 – Establishing a state conservation fund

Throughout our history the Coalition has focused on bringing attention to threats that exist on rangelands and pointing land stewards toward proven conservation practices and methods which protect, enhance, and regenerate the natural resources of our great state.

As threats ranging from woody encroachment, noxious weeds, and invasive species continue to spread across the state, private landowners, and operators, face daily battles in stopping the spread and impact of these threats.

The need for continuing education, awareness, and partnering with stakeholders to apply conservation on all land uses remains vital and urgent. This awareness and education needs are not just needs that exists within the rural areas of Kansas, but to all citizens and stakeholders that benefit and depend upon the natural resources so important to Kansas and the country.
