

Child Care Closure Data

Note: The current KDHE child care licensing system, "CLARIS", is a manual entry system that is only as good as the data entered by the child care licensing program. Prior to 2023, data may be considered unvetted and unverified. Beginning in 2023, KDHE began accurately capturing closure data and requesting "closure reason".

Total award by license type:

- Family Child Care Home \$994,242.52 (n = 172)
 - o Average award \$5,780.48
- Child Care Center/Preschool/School-age/Drop-in Program \$292,204.37 (n = 39)
 - o Average award \$7,492.42

Homes typically had a lower average likely due to lower square footage on items like flooring, playground cover, fences, etc. Some providers asked for only new ceiling tiles, cots, pack n' plays, cribs, and some play equipment. The larger center-style facilities have larger square footage and more industrial needs such as HVAC systems and fire alarms, but also higher volume of safe sleep equipment, flooring, playground cover, and larger play equipment that can handle a larger volume of children, fencing, etc.
