Testimony in Support of House Bill 2464  
Presented by Eric Stafford, Vice President of Government Affairs**

Mister Chairman and members of the committee, my name is Eric Stafford, Vice President of Government Affairs for the Kansas Chamber. The Kansas Chamber appreciates the opportunity to testify in support of House Bill 2464, which extends the aviation and aerospace tax credit for new graduates of aerospace and aviation educational programs.

While the first flight might have happened in North Carolina, the aviation industry has deep roots in Kansas. This industry is critical to the Kansas economy and employs tens of thousands of Kansans, either through direct employment or manufacturing suppliers and service companies. This important industry has faced direct competition from other states seeking to attract the well-paying aviation jobs from Kansas through industry-targeting tax credits.

HB 2464 would extend for 10 years the tax credit focused on the aviation industry, a program that is a benefit for both employees, and employers. For employers, HB 2464 would allow for a non-refundable 50% income tax credit for tuition reimbursed to a qualified employee. The credit could be claimed for up to four years if the employee remains employed with the qualified employer. HB 2464 would also allow for a non-refundable tax credit for up to five years for compensation paid to an employee, equal to 10% of the compensation paid but not to exceed \$15,000 annually for each qualifying employee.

Kansas faces nationwide competition as states try to attract these high-paying jobs and investment to their state. HB 2464 has been an effective tool to maintain existing and attract new investment from such an important industry.

In closing, the Legislature has taken many positive steps to strengthen our state's workforce development needs. We would respectfully ask this committee to support extending this program as a beneficial tool in the toolbox for companies and their workforce choosing to invest in our state.
