






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What action did the State Board take?





State Board Puts Focus on Reading





- Required all students in college preparing to teach elementary school to have Science of Reading courses and pass an exam on reading.
- Invested up to 25 million dollars to retrain all elementary teachers and administrators in the Science of Reading.
- Instituted an immediate stop to the practice of 3cueing.
- Required all elementary level educators and administrators to demonstrate their knowledge of the Science of Reading by 2028 to renew their licenses.

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Kansas Literacy Leaders


- Train local LETRS facilitators.

- Provide ongoing PD for literacy leaders to help teachers implement structured literacy.


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

• 184 Educators have taken the exam (90.2% passed) Passing percentage 9% higher than the national average (81%)

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
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
