Chairman Kessler and members of the House Federal and State Affairs Committee:

HB 2028 does two things.

First, it reinstates the Senior Lifetime Combination License with no sunset provisions. This license has been established for over 30 years, and by chance from what I was told the sunset happened right before hunting season last year. A notice went out stating that this license would no longer offered at about 3 PM in the afternoon. This license is for Kansans aged 65 - 75 for about \$40.00. This bill leaves the Sr. lifetime license with the only change being no sunset provision.

The second license is the Youth Lifetime Combination License, available for youth from birth to 7 years old. It currently has a sunset in 2032 and this bill only removes the sunset clause. So, when we get a new Secretary of KDWP and turnover of employees in the department, passing this bill will ensure that never happens again. This will encourage the 3 Rs for boosting hunter and angler participation and will help increase the future of enjoyment of hunting and fishing in Kansas. Recruitment, Retention, Reactivation is what this bill does.
