Testimony for HB 2159

The risk of exposure is real, and our officers should have immediate access to the tools they need to protect themselves and others in the line of duty.

Opioid antagonists like Narcan are proven to reverse the effects of opioid overdoses, and they are incredibly effective in those crucial first minutes when every second counts. By providing officers with access to this life-saving medication, we ensure they are better equipped to respond to these emergencies, protect the public, and safeguard their own health.

The opioid epidemic affects all of us. It is not just a problem for individuals struggling with addiction – it is a public health crisis that impacts families, communities, and the very fabric of our society. If we truly want to take action to protect our families and our futures, we must ensure that those who are first on the scene in these life-or-death situations are fully prepared. This grant fund is a necessary step toward ensuring that our law enforcement officers have the resources they need to save lives, protect themselves, and serve our communities with the safety and dignity they deserve. I urge you to support this bill and take action to create a safer, healthier Kansas for all.
