

Oral Neutral Testimony on HB 2320, children in foster care In House K12 Education BudgetCommittee By Leah Fliter, Assistant Executive Director of Advocacy Kansas Association of School Boards

Mr. Chair and Members of the Committee,

KASB appears today as neutral on HB 2320. As always, our testimony is based on our memberadopted legislative policy.

Our 2025 State Resolution stipulates that we support *improved collaboration across agencies and* with the Legislature to support educational outcomes for students in foster care or experiencing homelessness.

School districts work closely with the Department of Children and Families to support the educational needs of children in foster care. Additionally, KASB is a standing member of the Kansas Educational Stability for Children in Foster Care Workgroup, which meets monthly.

We appear as neutral today because HB 2320 substantially duplicates federal law on the education of children in foster care, including that if it is not in the best interest of a foster child to remain in their school of origin, the child must be accepted without delay in their new school.
