The Kansas' historic preservation program provides many familiar economic benefits. Investment & development, job creation, local economic growth, tourism, business attraction, and expanded property, employment, and sales tax bases. In your cost-benefit analyses, please don't forget the intangibles that ultimately drive the economic benefits that justify this bill.

The House should consider the positive impact on individual families, careers, and the quality of life this bill will open for Kansans. One story relates to friends that run The Beacon near the State Capitol in Topeka. The business is run by two sisters and their husbands. They took a big risk relying on this program, renovating the former "Women's Club" building at 9th and Topeka Blvd. The building was antiquated and destined for blight or the landfill. They now run their family business out of the facility. We worked firsthand with The Beacon; the project would not have happened without this program.

Outside of a handful of select areas, Kansas is desperate for economic activity and development. SB 227 will open more opportunity for small business, non-profits, and individual families to make an impact on our State. This is what we desperately need. These small drivers will result in bigger developments.

We strongly believe that if the State of Kansas makes an investment in SB 227, the intangible benefits will result in definable economic benefits for the State. Benefits that retain our culture & history, reduce urban decay, strengthen arts & education, and incentivize affordable housing – these will increase our quality of life. Just as important - these intangibles are what will attract bigger developments and a stronger tax base.
