Chairperson Tyson and Members of the Committee,

We are pleased to provide written testimony supporting the elimination of 1.5 mills of property tax for state building maintenance.

The proposal would save taxpayers approximately \$75 million annually and make a separate provision for a direct transfer of \$75 million from the State General Fund to provide building maintenance.

There should be no question that the State can afford to provide this small amount of tax relief. According to the National Association of State Budget Officers (NASBO), Kansas spent 56% more per resident in FY 2023 than the states that don't have an income tax and 48% more than the 10 states with the lowest state and local tax burdens (Tax Foundation).
